Sistema Aotearoa is beneficial to the Otara-Papatoetoe community as shown by independent evaluation. It has grown in numbers and profile since its beginning in April 2011. It has become part of the Otara community within which it operates and collaborates with local community support organisations, and arts and cultural groups. The programme promotes a model of social development and change that employs the model of children playing in an orchestra as its catalyst. Sistema Aotearoa's holistic approach encourages positive behaviour and mutual respect amongst its students and through them, these same qualities are brought into the home and out into the community. That this programme in Otara is held up as an exemplar to other Sistema-based programmes around New Zealand and the world is evidence of the young people of Otara working towards excellence.

Akarana Regional Senior Citizen's Forum

Akarana Regional Senior Citizen's Forum was established as a charitable trust earlier this year in an attempt to give our senior citizens a voice when dealing with the region's elected local body representatives, i.e.; council, local boards, District Health Boards, licensing trusts, and parliamentary representatives, i.e.; electorate and list MP's. The Forum hopes to work creditably and effectively with all senior citizen-based groups in the region but not in a political capacity. Collaborating with Age Concern, Grey Power and Auckland Councils Senior's Panel on issues of concern to all senior citizens in the region is the prime focus of the Forum.

Issues of interest to the Forum include:

- (1). Retirement planning;
- (2). Rent increases at Council and HousingNZ- run facilities;
- (3). Common room availability;
- (4). Genuine public representation
- (5). Cultural sensitivity (media/public perceptions);
- (6). Security;
- (7). Community's/Senior's Co-operation Accord; and
- (8). Life After Work Initiatives,

The Forum will be pushing for senior advisory panels on all licensing trusts, local boards, and DHB's in the region and will seek assistance from the Police to establish a senior's liaison panel to address safety and security concerns our seniors may have. Seniors panels working with SPARC, MoE, MoJ, Corrections, MoH etc are also planned.

The Forum will be running a number of public meetings and/or workshops soon to gauge public understanding of, and/or support for what we are doing and to seek community input into the issue of senior citizen well being in the region.

Our focus is "Community First" and the well being of our seniors is a major priority. Please Help Us To Help Them!
