Local Board Meeting - Aotea Boardriders Club representation.

We stand in front of you today in the midst of a very exciting time for the club Manuka, Renee and I represent, Aotea Boardriders Club, well known on Great Barrier Island as the ABC. I'll begin with a bit of background information to bring you up to speed to where this club stands today.

Everything began just over 10 years ago, a group of around 20 young surfers and partners wanting to unite as a group, put on a surf comp and create an identity for surfers on the island. Our ABC logo hoodies were made that first year, and continue today to be our main source of fundraising, enabling us to put on our surf comps. From the inaugural comp we have included a grommie under 15 year old section, a couple of years later providing a separate competition day for the keen young surfers. Over the years the members have come to realise this involvement with the youth is what it's all about. Seeing the young surfers progress through the surf lessons and challenging themselves in the surf competitions has kept pushing us to keep the club functioning year after year. This year is the fifth year running of our inter club competition with Mangawhai Boardriders Club, MBR. Alternating years the clubs visit each other's home waves competing for the title that ABC have managed to hold for the last four years!

The way the club functions at the moment is at the point of change. For the last 7 years we have had land kindly offered for our use by the Blackwells, Charlie and Winnie. A rusty old bus was placed on the land and boardwalks from Castaway made the deck that we have used for our meeting rooms ever since. Last year the bus was taken away, the boardwalks are falling away and it is time for us to upgrade.

At the end of last year we applied for funding for the first time since our beginning. After being pointed in the direction and assisted in the process by Christina from the local board, we have made it into stage two of the Central Facility Partnership Fund applications. For the initial Expression of interest stage of the application process we considered our location at the end of Ocean view Road and planned to construct three small moveable sheds connected by a large deck. This would align with our agreement with the Blackwells.

Since the application was successful, we have had new exciting developments for the club. On discussions with people from the Auckland Council we have an exciting prospect of placing our clubrooms on a council reserve at Medlands. Medlands is an ideal location for an Aotea Boardriders clubroom. Every one of our grommie competitions and our surf school lessons have been held at Medlands beach. Most of our other comps have also been held here. It's central location will be attractive for other local groups use, especially the SEA academy with whom we have been working with for about 5 years now putting on surfing lessons for local school kids, every Tuesday in the first and last terms. Having a piece of grass would also enable us to hold small sporting events and surf functions. The possibilities are exciting.

The application closes for this funding round in about two weeks, and we are at a point where we need to get this application in, but there seems to be so many variables with new possibilities. We have also been advised to become an incorporated society or trust? Do we change our clubroom design now that we have a new location possibility? Will this opportunity for council owned land come through fast enough to align with this central facility fund application if we are successful? Where will we find the rest of the money for the project, as the facility fund is for a maximum of 65% of project costs?

We come to you today to bring you up to speed with the club happenings, and ask for your support with our endeavours. Having the support of the local board would ease our transition into this unknown territory of funding applications and everything that involves. We are also enthusiastic about beginning a relationship with the local board and Council. Can you see why we are all excited at the prospects for the future of our club? Big things are happening for us!
