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Temporary Alcohol Ban for the Rolling Stones concert

File No.: CP2014/04630

Purpose

1. The purpose of this report is to obtain approval from the Regulatory and Bylaws Committee for temporary alcohol controls in the external environs of Mount Smart Stadium (the venue) for the Rolling Stones concert from 6.00am on Saturday 5 April 2014 until 6.00am the following day (Sunday 6 April 2014).

Executive Summary

2. A temporary alcohol control request was received from the New Zealand Police on 10 March 2014 for the streets surrounding the venue for the Rolling Stones concert. See attachment A.
3. Temporary alcohol controls are a proven tool for managing anti-social behaviour and support safer events. Staff recommend that this temporary alcohol control is approved.

Recommendation

That the Regulatory and Bylaws Committee pursuant to the Auckland City Council Bylaw Part 14 (Liquor Control in Public Places) 2004:

- a) approve a temporary alcohol ban, as requested by the New Zealand Police, for the Rolling Stones concert from 6.00am, Saturday 5 April 2014 until 6.00am, on the following day (Sunday 6 April 2014) to include:

Great South Road (between Station Road and Penrose Road), O'Rorke Road, Rockridge Road, Olive Road, Fairfax Avenue, Botha Road, Hugo Johnston Drive, South Park Place, Autumn Place, Maurice Road, Goodman Place, Henderson Place, Rockfield Road (between Station Road and Oranga Avenue) Bassant Avenue and Burrett Avenue.

Discussion

4. The Regulatory and Bylaws Committee have the delegated authority to introduce a temporary liquor ban under the Auckland City Council Bylaw Part 14 (Liquor Control in Public Places) 2004.
5. Temporary alcohol controls are a proven tool for managing anti-social behaviour and support safer events. Alcohol bans in the external environs of major venues are designed to reduce the amount of alcohol consumed on the way to an event (commonly known as preloading) and form only part of the security response managed by the New Zealand Police, the council and event organisers.
6. Temporary alcohol bans for special events can reduce the adverse impacts of events on local businesses and neighbourhoods by reducing levels of intoxication, litter (broken bottles) and other harms associated with alcohol consumption at in public places.

Consideration

Local Board Views

7. The Maungakiekie-Tāmaki Local Board support of the temporary alcohol controls as proposed has been received.

Maori Impact Statement

8. The Māori Responsiveness Advisor for the New Zealand Police Central District supports the use of temporary alcohol controls as a preventative approach to managing alcohol harm at events. Additional tools and strategies are required to ensure a holistic approach to alcohol harm reduction and to educate rangatahi (youth) about responsible attitudes and behaviors around alcohol.

Implementation Issues

9. The costs associated with implementing an alcohol ban are covered by the event organiser. These costs include temporary signage (in both English and Te Reo), and any other requirements of the New Zealand Police or the Maungakiekie-Tamaki Local Board

Re: Mt Smart Stadium Temporary Liquor Ban

The purpose of this letter is to formally request, from the New Zealand Police, a temporary Liquor Ban around the venue; Mt Smart stadium, Penrose Auckland.

Over recent years Temporary Liquor Bans have significantly assisted in curbing alcohol related harm and offending in public areas.

The purpose of this Liquor Ban will be to prevent patrons from consuming alcohol in the vicinity of the venue, prior to and after the event.

The Rolling Stones are performing a concert at this venue on the evening of Saturday the 5th of April 2014.

The proposed times and dates are 0600 hrs on Saturday the 5th of April 2014 to 0600 hrs on Sunday the 6th of April 2014.

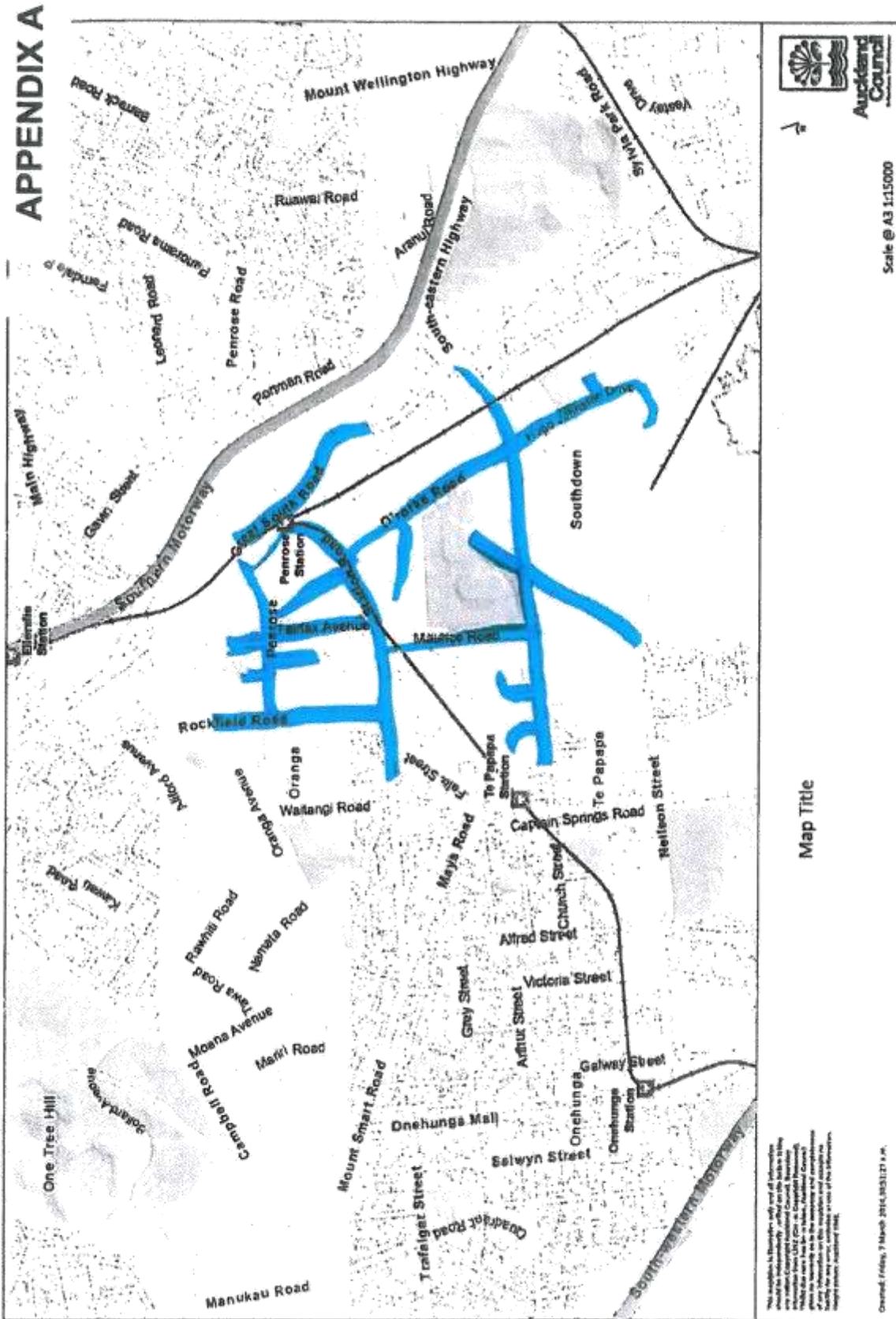
The proposed streets / area to be included in the Liquor Ban are attached as Appendix A.

This document outlines the planned event operations taking place in the public spaces outside the stadium grounds for the scheduled Rolling Stones concert being held at Mount Smart Stadium on Saturday 5th of April 2014.

The operational plans detailed below have been put in place following input from other operational stakeholders including NZ Police, Auckland Transport and Auckland Council.

Information on specific operations within the stadium should be sought from Mount Smart Stadium which can be found at www.aucklandstadiums.co.nz.

Crowd estimate: Planning for this event reflects expected attendance of approximately 32,000 (as informed by Regional Facilities Auckland).

Mount Smart Stadium surrounds	Saturday 5 April	4.00pm	8.00pm	11.00pm

Rain date: There is no rain date for this event.

Ticketing information: This is a ticketed event; details can be found at www.ticketmaster.co.nz.

EVENT OPERATIONS

Noise / amplified sound: This event will meet the provisions of the concept plan for the venue and will be monitored by Auckland Council's Environmental Noise Specialist and the venues consultant Hegley Acoustics.

Waste management: United Cleaning Services have been contracted by Mount Smart Stadium to manage waste from the event in the public environ surrounding the stadium. A waste plan will be submitted to Auckland Council for approval, this plan will include management of the temporary liquor ban.

Portaloos: Portaloos will be placed at transport hubs and along main routes into the venue; locations and numbers are yet to be confirmed.

Structures: Public transport infrastructure and barrier queuing systems installed by Auckland Transport will be in place outside the stadium.

Signage: Way-finding and traffic management signage will be placed outside the stadium grounds.

Security: NZ Police will review the security plan. Security in the venue will be provided by Redbadge. Public transport security and queue management will be provided by Platform 4 group.

Liquor: Alcohol in-venue will be provided by Spotless Catering under a mix of special and on licenses around the venue. The Police have requested a temporary liquor ban around the stadium for the duration of the event; approval for this being sought from the local board and Auckland Council under urgency.

TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT:

A traffic management plan will be implemented by Traffic Management NZ on behalf of Mt Smart Stadium, following consultation with Auckland Transport.

Road closures:

- Beasley Avenue shall be closed Saturday 5 April from 6.00am until 1.00am the following day (Sunday 6 April)
- Hugo Johnson Drive, Maurice Road, Rockridge Avenue and O'Rorke Road shall be closed Saturday 5 April from 3.00pm until 1.00am the following day (Sunday 6 April)
- Station Road (between Rockfield and Great South Road), Walls Road, Olive Road, Botha Road and Fairfax Avenue shall be closed Saturday 5 April from 9.00pm until 1.00am the following day (Sunday 6 April)

Parking restrictions: The following parking restrictions will be in place from 6.00am Saturday 5 April until 1.00am the following day. (Sunday 6 April)

Buses only are permitted to park in the below spaces during the closure period.

- O'Rourke Road between Station Road and Church Road (both sides)
- Hugo Johnston Drive up to and including the cul de sac
- Station Road between Maurice Road and Rockfield Road
- Fairfax avenue both kerb lines.

The following parking restrictions will be in place from 6.00am Saturday 5 April until 1.00am the following day. (Sunday 6 April)

No stopping of any vehicle

- Beasley Avenue, Penrose, both kerb lines
- Rockridge Road, Penrose, both kerb lines
- Maurice Road, Penrose, both kerb lines from Station Road, to Church Street
- Station Road, Penrose, northern kerb line from Rockfield Road to Walls Road
- Station Road, Penrose, southern kerb line from a point 116.0m from the eastern line of Maurice Road, extending east to a point 66.0m from the western kerb line of O'Rorke Road
- Station Road, Penrose, southern kerb line from a point 80.0m from the eastern kerb line of O'Rorke Road, extending east to a point 86.0m from the southern kerb line of Walls Road
- Rockfield Road, Penrose, both kerb lines from Station Road, extending north for a distance of 50.0m
- O'Rorke Road, Penrose, western kerb line from Church Street, extending north to a point 135.0m from the southern kerb line of Station Road
- Hugo Johnston Drive, Penrose, eastern kerb line from Church Street, to Autumn Place

Public transport: The road closures are in place to assist and facilitate the safe ingress and egress of event patrons and public transport services. Integrated ticketing will be implemented which gives event patrons access to special event buses and trains with their event ticket. For up to date information on bus, train and ferry services visit www.at.co.nz.

Mobility parking: Mobility parking is accommodated inside the venue adjacent to field number four, access to this area is pre-arranged with the venue.

EVENT COMMUNICATIONS

Local notification / engagement: Mount Smart Stadium Management will send local residents and businesses a letter outlining operational provisions including road closures (copy available upon request).

A Road Closure Notice will be placed in the NZ Herald advertising road closures.
