## Summary of submissions to the Draft Papakura Local Board Plan 2014

File No.: CP2014/18715

### Purpose

1. This report provides high-level analysis of key themes contained in submissions to the Draft Papakura Local Board Plan 2014.

### Executive summary

2. The Local Government Act 2002 and Local Government (Auckland Council) Act 2009 require Council to use the special consultative procedure in adopting the Papakura Local Board Plan 2014. This includes ensuring any person submitting on the Draft Papakura Local Board Plan 2014 is given reasonable opportunity to be heard.
3. 93 submissions were received to the Draft Papakura Local Board Plan 2014. Of these, 21 were proforma submissions relating to Smokefree issues, 27 submissions were received to all draft local board plans.
4. 28 submitters from the Papakura Local Board area submitted on other boards, and 36 submitters from outside the Papakura Local Board area submitted on the draft plan.
5. 16 submitters requested the opportunity to speak in support of their submission at a public hearing.
6. The Papakura Local Board asked submitters for feedback on four questions.
7. Question one asked submitters to prioritise and rank three new initiatives between 1 (most important) and 3 (least important). The initiative that received the most number 1 rankings was “working with business and investors to create a better, more attractive and prosperous town centre”. This also received the highest overall number of responses.
8. Question two asked whether submitters had any other comments regarding the outcomes, objectives and initiatives contained in the Draft Papakura Local Board Plan 2014.
9. Question three asked submitters whether they believed there was anything missing from the plan. 30 comments were made relating to the board’s outcomes, and 39 comments were made relating to issues unrelated to these outcomes. Of these 13 comments were related to Smokefree initiatives.

### Recommendation/s

That the Local Board Plan Hearings - Papakura Local Board:

- a) Receive submissions on the Draft Papakura Local Board Plan 2014.
- b) Hear the relevant submissions on the Draft Papakura Local Board Plan 2014.
- c) Thank submitters for their verbal presentations on the Draft Papakura Local Board Plan 2014.
- d) Consider any potential amendments to the Draft Papakura Local Board Plan 2014.

### Comments

#### Context

10. The Local Government Act 2002 and Local Government (Auckland Council) Act 2009 require Council to use the special consultative procedure in adopting the Papakura Local Board Plan 2014. This includes ensuring any person submitting on the Draft Papakura Local Board Plan 2014 is given reasonable opportunity to be heard.

11. This report provides statistics on submissions received to the Draft Papakura Local Board Plan 2014 and a brief high-level analysis of key themes and topics.
12. More detailed analysis of submissions will be provided to the local board workshop on 3 September 2014.
13. The consultation period for the Draft Papakura Local Board Plan 2014 was held from 7 July 2014 to 5pm 6 August 2014.

### Submissions

14. Council received and processed 93 submissions to the Draft Papakura Local Board Plan 2014 with 17 submitters requesting to be heard.
15. 21 pro forma submissions were received to the Papakura Local Board Plan 2014. These all advocated for a SmokeFree policy in the Papakura Local Board area.
16. Copies of submissions to the Draft Papakura Local Board Plan 2014 are provided in attachment A of this report.

### Overview of feedback from submissions to the Draft Papakura Local Board Plan 2014

17. The Papakura Local Board asked submitters for feedback on three questions.
18. Question one asked submitters to prioritise and rank three new initiatives between 1 (most important) and 3 (least important).
19. Table 1 below shows how submitters ranked each of the projects proposed to them. Overall ranking was determined by allocating 3 points to first preference, 2 points to second preference, 1 point to third preference giving a weighted total for overall preference).

20. The results in the table above indicate that the overall preference was for the first initiative "Working with businesses and investors to create a better, more attractive and prosperous town centre".
21. Question two asked submitters if they had any comments on the outcomes, objectives and initiatives detailed in the Draft Papakura Local Board Plan 2014. Owing to the large number of outcomes, objectives and initiatives, the data is widely spread, with small numbers responding to individual items.



22. Outcome – *A vibrant town centre* received five responses in support. A further 11 responses were received in support of various objectives and initiatives within the outcome.
23. Outcome – *A skilled workforce for local jobs* together with its objectives and initiatives received a total of five responses in support.
24. Outcome – *Well-connected and easy to move around* received a total of six responses in support of its objectives and initiatives.
25. Outcome – *Treasured for its environment and heritage* together with its objectives and initiatives received a total of nine responses in support.
26. Outcome – *Strong, safe and healthy communities* received four responses in support. Its objectives and initiatives received a further 11 responses in support.
27. Question three asked submitters whether they believed there were any items missing from the Draft Papakura Local Board Plan 2014. Table 1 indicates the number of missing items for each outcome.

28. Of the eight comments relating to *A vibrant town centre*, five mentioned the removal of \$2 shops and filling empty shops in the town centre.
29. There were no common themes in responses to the other outcomes.
30. Other items identified as missing from the plan that did not fit within the outcomes, objectives and initiatives, included seven related to arts, culture and events services and five related to parks services.
31. Submitters also made comments unrelated to the board's outcomes, objectives and initiatives. The most notable topic areas are listed below:
  - nine submitters made general comments about the plan, although no common themes emerged
  - five submitters made requests for funding. These included two requests related to the funding for implementation of Smokefree initiatives.

### Next steps

32. Decisions on the final Papakura Local Board Plan 2014 will be made at the decision-making meeting on 15 October 2014.

## Consideration

### Local board views and implications

33. The Papakura Local Board will consider all submissions to the Draft Papakura Local Board Plan 2014 at the Local Board Plan 2014 hearing meeting on Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> August at Papakura Service Centre, 35 Coles Crescent, Papakura.

### Māori impact statement

34. The Papakura Local Board has given consideration to Māori outcomes throughout the development of the Papakura Local Board Plan; consequently the implementation of the Plan has the potential for positive outcomes for Māori.
35. Local mana whenua were invited to a southern sub regional Hui on 8 March 2014 where their views were sought on the issues to be addressed in southern local board's plans, including Papakura. The processes and protocols for ongoing engagement were also discussed and follow up contact made by the local board chairs.
36. The Papakura Local Board also engaged with Māori rate payers and residents through engagement activities that were accessible to the general public as well as targeted stakeholder events both in the early stages of the Plan's development and throughout the consultation period. A focused meeting with the staff at Papakura Marae enabled the dissemination of awareness and literature through the networks coordinated there, which particularly involve local mataawaka Māori.
37. The outcomes, objectives and initiatives included in the plan will support the delivery of the Auckland Plan Transformational shift 6 – "significantly lift Maori social and economic wellbeing". The draft Papakura Local Board Plan includes initiatives of particular relevance to mana whenua and mataawaka. These include support for Māori businesses; training and skills programmes for Māori youth; protection and enhancement of the Manukau Harbour; improvement of water quality in catchment streams; and the identification and protection of wahi tapu in and around Papakura.

### Implementation

38. Implementation issues on the various matters raised in submissions will be considered when making decisions at decision-making meetings on the Draft Papakura Local Board Plan 2014 on 17 September 2014.
