### I SUBMIT AS FOLLOWS:

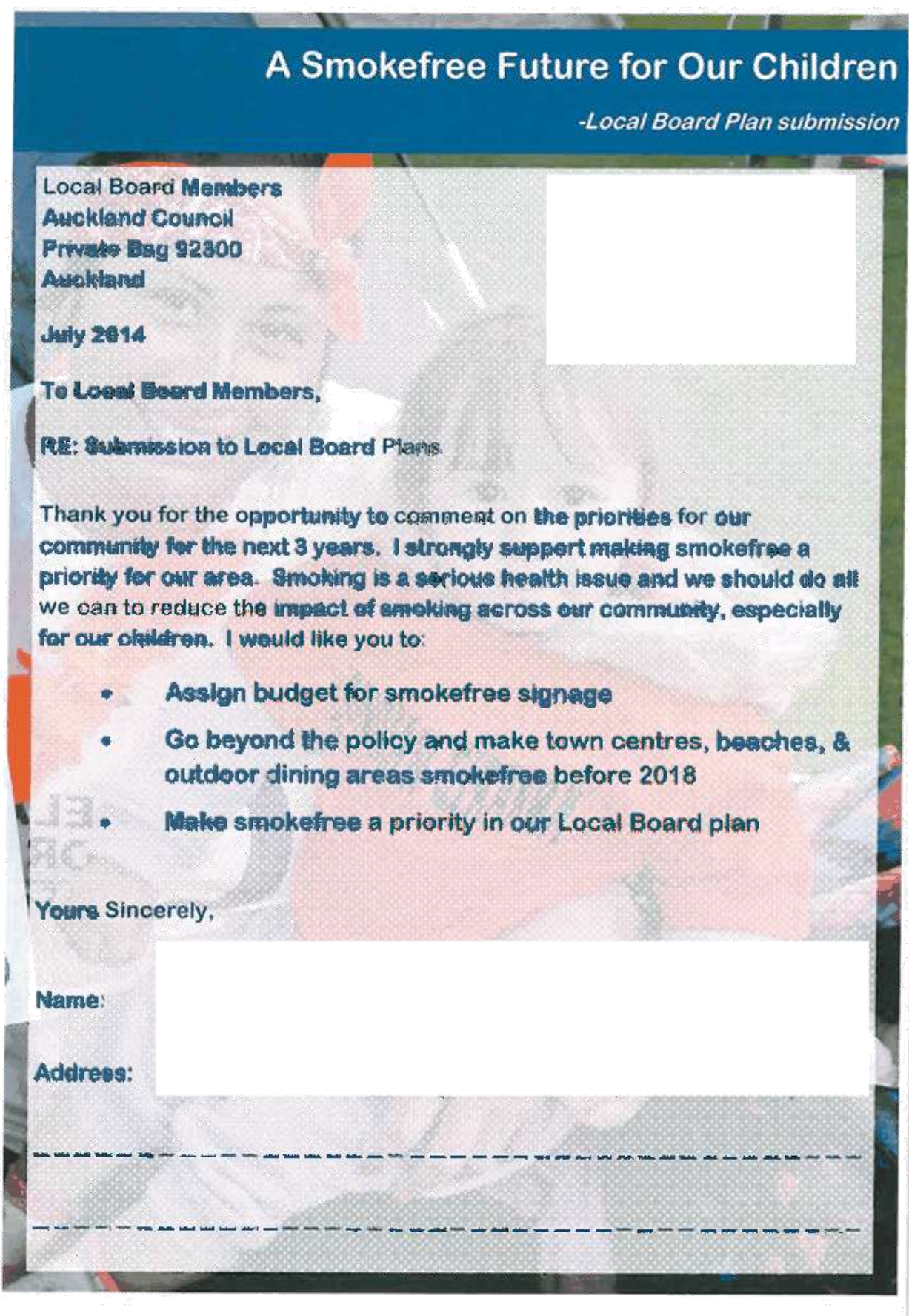
- That there be an urgent historic character assessment and survey of New Lynn, in particular, any areas not currently included in the historic character overlays. This is to allow the full extent of what historic character is left in New Lynn to be identified, recorded and protected.
- That a heritage survey be carried out to identify important brick character buildings, (both residential and commercial) which specifically relate to local history.
- That buildings which have then been identified and have no protections against them, be put forward for scheduling with the support of the Whau Local Board.
- That the first phase of a heritage survey be carried out to identify important brick character buildings in the Special Housing Areas as an urgent high priority.
- That no demolition or removal of any pre-1944 buildings in New Lynn be allowed until the full historic character assessment has been carried out.
- That any demolition or removal of Pre-1944 buildings within New Lynn be publicly notifiable.
- That a strategy be put in place which enables us to preserve the history of New Lynn's brick making, clay history, brick architecture and what remains of early New Lynn settlement pre-1920.
- That our architectural heritage be given its own place in the Whau Local Board Plan rather than falling under Arts and Culture to ensure that preservation is afforded critical importance; not downgraded to that of artificial heritage.

Starting with identifying the Heritage building by funding and putting into action a historic character assessment and survey of New Lynn, in particular, any areas not currently included in the historic character overlays. This is to allow the full extent of what historic character is left in New Lynn to be identified, recorded and protected.
810	Michelle Driscoll	Would like to see New Lynn's heritage buildings saved & restored; and yes to healthy waterways and natural environment.
842	Amanda Wooldridge	Don't destroy New Lynn's heritage and historical buildings to implement these plans. Rather, include history for further generations.

Also, better links between the light industry area, Unitec and Avondale to make it the arts hub of Central Auckland. Not to mention the industry in New Lynn; and a better police presence in the area as there is a large police station in Avondale and yet no visible presence.
