

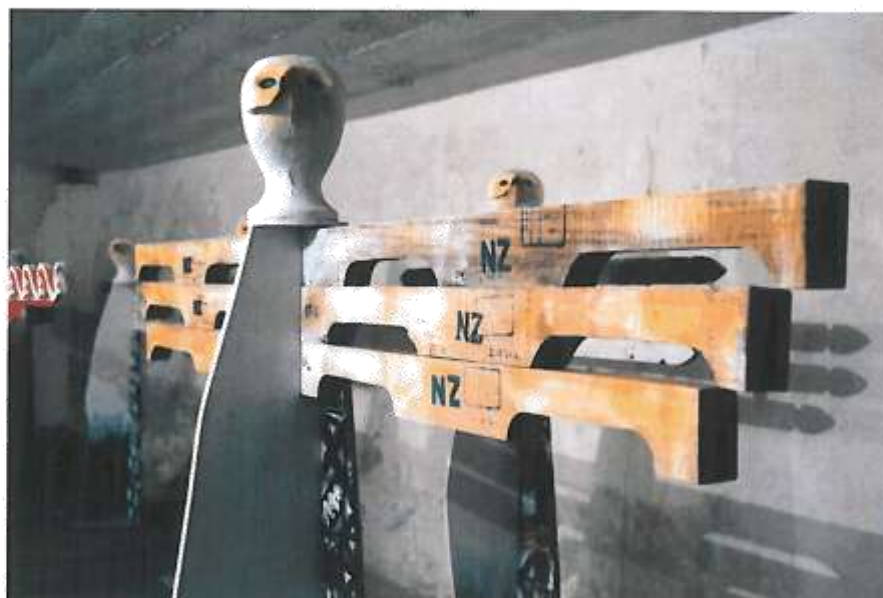

Partnering Agreement

Thriving Communities In Kaipātiki



Kaipātiki Local Board and
Kaipātiki Community Facilities Trust



BACKGROUND

The relationship between the Kaipātiki Community Facilities Trust (KCFT) and Kaipātiki Local Board (KLB) grew from long standing arrangements between their predecessor entities -the Birkenhead Community Facilities Trust established in 1982 and the Birkenhead and North Shore City Councils. The Kaipātiki Community Facilities Trust is the community development delivery arm for the Kaipātiki Local Board.

PURPOSE

The parties envisage their strong relationship continuing, and this Agreement presents how the Kaipātiki Local Board (KLB) and Kaipātiki Community Facilities Trust (KCFT) intend to work together to support Kaipātiki's residents and communities to thrive. These two entities have common values and a shared interest in creating the world's most liveable city at the local level, through community engagement, community led development, placemaking and neighbourhood development.

SCOPE

This Agreement involves working together to make goal setting, relationship development and performance review as seamless as possible across the various funded deliverables. This Agreement is entered into on a voluntary basis and either party may withdraw from the Agreement at any time. This Agreement does not guarantee award of funding for projects or services in the future, nor limit either party from funding or obtaining services from other sources.

TERM OF THE AGREEMENT

This Agreement will run for the duration of the current Kaipātiki Local Board Plan, unless either party withdraws, and may be renewed in conjunction with any subsequent Kaipātiki Local Board Plan by agreement of the parties.

GUIDING PRINCIPLES

These shared principles will guide the relationship between the two parties:

- a commitment to community led development, community empowerment and delivering on the intent of the Thriving Communities Action Plan
- a focus on achieving community outcomes and delivering on local board priorities

- two way accountability and a spirit of partnership
- collaboration, regular contact and an inclusive way of working
- effective two way communication, addressing issues early and no surprises
- acting with honesty and in good faith
- behaviour and processes that build respect, trust, generosity, reciprocity and openness
- recognition of the autonomy and independence of both parties
- a sense of humour and celebration of progress and achievement.

ROLE OF KAIPĀTIKI LOCAL BOARD

The KLB will enable the KCFT to deliver quality community development and community engagement services in Kaipātiki by providing:

- funding and other resources in line with an agreed work programme or activities (at the KLB's discretion)
- support for initiatives that lead to tangible results and meaningful progress towards shared visions, outcomes and priorities
- access to training and development opportunities for the board and staff of KCFT
- access to knowledge, research, timely information and evaluation support
- peer support from council staff, including the unlocking of council expertise and resources for KCFT
- leveraging of relationships and connections to add value to council programmes and activities
- open communication channels, timely engagement and opportunities for collaboration.

ROLE OF KAIPĀTIKI COMMUNITY FACILITIES TRUST

The KCFT will deliver to a high standard a work programme which is agreed annually with the KLB, through a collaborative process. This work programme will form Schedule One of an annual funding agreement (subject to approval by KLB). Any other specific programmes of work undertaken will be expressed via funding agreements or other appropriate

contractual documentation. The work programme will be based on outcomes and priorities in the Kaipātiki Local Board Plan, which in turn reflect council strategic direction including the Auckland Plan and Thriving Communities Action Plan.

In delivering this agreed work programme KCFT will:

- demonstrate a community empowerment and community led philosophy
- take a strengths and asset based approach
- work collaboratively and strategically to make a positive difference in Kaipātiki
- use creative methods to engage communities and support community led activity
- coordinate work programmes to maximise beneficial outcomes.

ISSUE RESOLUTION

Should any performance issues, disagreement or relationship issues arise, the Chairperson of both parties will meet in the first instance to seek a mutually agreeable resolution. If required, a mediator that is agreed by both parties will be appointed to support the parties to resolve the issue. If this fails, both parties retain the right to decide on an appropriate course of action and advise the other party of their decision.

REPORTING AND REVIEW

As a minimum, the KCFT will report quarterly on the agreed work programme to the KLB. Evaluation and mutual accountability requirements will be included in the annual work programme and specific funding agreements. The parties may commission independent evaluations from time to time to assess the performance of the KLB and KCFT against this Agreement and delivery of the work programme. These evaluations will focus on the multiple lines of work and how to strengthen delivery and effective partnering between the two parties.

Both parties will collaborate to communicate activity and achievements on a regular basis to the Kaipātiki community. While the work programme is negotiated annually, this Agreement can be amended upon the request of one or both parties, through an agreed process.
