The importance of protecting and improving the Manukau Harbour

- 2nd largest harbour/estuary in New Zealand
- Highly significant cultural and ecological importance
- Home to mullet, flounder, gurnard, shark and Maui dolphins – one of the rarest dolphin species in the world
- Often hosts up to 50,000 birds including Arctic migrants and the threatened NZ dotterel
- Rainwater from your business site enters stormwater drains and flows directly into the harbour
- It takes simple planning to prevent contaminants and pollution from getting into drains
- Your efforts will help improve and protect the Manukau Harbour's environmental, cultural, recreational and economic value today and long into the future

The Manukau Harbour Forum, a collective of advocates from the nine local boards that border the Manukau Harbour, funds this project. The forum has contracted Wilkinson Environmental Limited to deliver this programme.
