Funding Requests

Purpose

1. To consider requests for board funding contributions from two local organisations, received over the Christmas/New Year meeting recess.

Executive Summary

2. Two requests for funding support have been received from local organisations since the 9 December 2015 business meeting. As the January 2016 business meeting was cancelled, these requests have not been able to come before the local board until the 17 February 2016 meeting.
3. The first request is from the Counties Manukau Zone of New Zealand Rugby League Inc (see Attachment A) seeking \$10,000 towards providing local events in partnership with the local board. In December 2014, the local board made a discretionary grant of \$10,000 towards the 2015 Waitangi Day 9s tournament but this was not an on-going annual funding arrangement. If the local board considers this year's request favourably, it may also wish to consider partnership provision for the 2017 tournament within the local events programme, as part of budget planning for 2016/2017.
4. The second request is from Papakura Community Crimewatch Patrol Inc (see Attachment B) seeking \$2833.60 for a portable CCTV camera for placement in hotspots where there is illegal dumping of rubbish. The portable nature of the camera will also enable it to be used in other locations as issues arise. Papakura Community Crimewatch Patrol has received an annual contribution from the council of \$20,000 towards operational costs. This request is additional to the normal operational costs for 2015/2016.
5. There is sufficient funding remaining in the locally driven initiatives 'community response fund' to cover both of these requests.

Recommendation/s

That the Papakura Local Board:

- a) Consider making a partnership contribution of \$10,000 from the locally driven initiatives community response fund, to Counties Manukau Zone of New Zealand Rugby League Inc;
- b) Consider making a contribution of \$2833.60 from the locally driven initiatives community response fund, to Papakura Community Crimewatch Patrols Inc for procurement of a portable CCTV camera.

Subject – CMRL Waitangi Day Club 9s Tournament

2015 Summary

The 2015 inaugural CMRL Waitangi Day 9s was a huge success with 8 of the 12 Counties Manukau Rugby League clubs competing. This was the first time a Nine Aside tournament had been offered exclusively to our grassroots clubs & community, meaning there was no qualifying criteria as such, so long as a club could field a team and was based in the Counties Manukau region, it was guaranteed entry.

This allowed the smaller and lower ranked clubs the opportunity to test their skill against clubs ranked higher in the regular competition. This was an attractive incentive for clubs and we saw minor clubs like Papatoetoe beat more favored teams throughout the competition and eventually finish 4th overall and Runners Ups of the Plate section.

The final was a great spectacle with Papakura Sea Eagle proving their dominance with a 22 – 4 win over Otahuhu Leopards. You couldn't have asked for a better script with the host team winning the inaugural tournament and setting the bench mark for future tournaments.

Waitangi Day Celebration

Let's not forget the tournament was a great opportunity for the residents of Papakura and surrounding communities to celebrate Waitangi Day and the signing of the Treaty in a manner which unites communities through a common interest, Rugby League.

The opening started with Local Board member Michael Turner delivering a powerful speech which signified what the treaty meant and how residents of the Papakura area could come together through sport and effect positive change. He went on to say Rugby League had the ability to inspire and unite people in a way little else can, as it speaks to people in a language they understand which ultimately has the ability to build a stronger community

Year 2, 2016 Partnership Proposal

CMRL has enjoyed our partnership with the Papakura Local Board and would like to build on this and have it more commonly known throughout the Counties Manukau region. Newspaper articles and other publication signalling this joint venture are planned and greater spectator attendance is expected in 2016 as awareness increases.

Building stronger communities through Rugby League

Ten (10) teams have expressed their interest in entering the tournament this year which is only two (2) off our targeted number of entries (12). Massey Park is the ideal venue to host this tournament with a mini stadium type feel and room around the parameter of the field to erect gazebos for teams. The pools being right next door provides the added bonus for recovery sessions, which was utilised by several of the teams in year one.

The Dick Smith NRL Auckland Nines dates have been moved in 2016 and will now be staged on the same weekend as our scheduled tournament. This has forced us to rethink how we can deliver another successful tournament that meets all the desired outcomes and still attracts the wider community to participate in celebrating Waitangi Day.

So in 2016 the CMRL Waitangi Day Tournament will commence in the afternoon of Friday 5th February 2016 and go into the night, creating a new experience for the Rugby League community. This will see all pool matches played and will concluded by 9:30pm. In addition to this we will intend invitations to the visiting NRL teams to come and view our local talent.

The final games will be played on Saturday 6th Feb commencing at 9.00am and concluding at approximately 12.30pm.

Benefits to the Local Community and Beyond

This annual tournament offers a number of opportunities for Papakura residents, the Local Board and local business;

- Use of Massey Park and its facilities for the wider community
- Positive exposure for the Papakura Region, Local Board and Counties Manukau Rugby League.
- An opportunity for NRL teams to visit Papakura and view local talent.
- Exposure for young local talent.
- Local business exposed to potential customers during this period.
