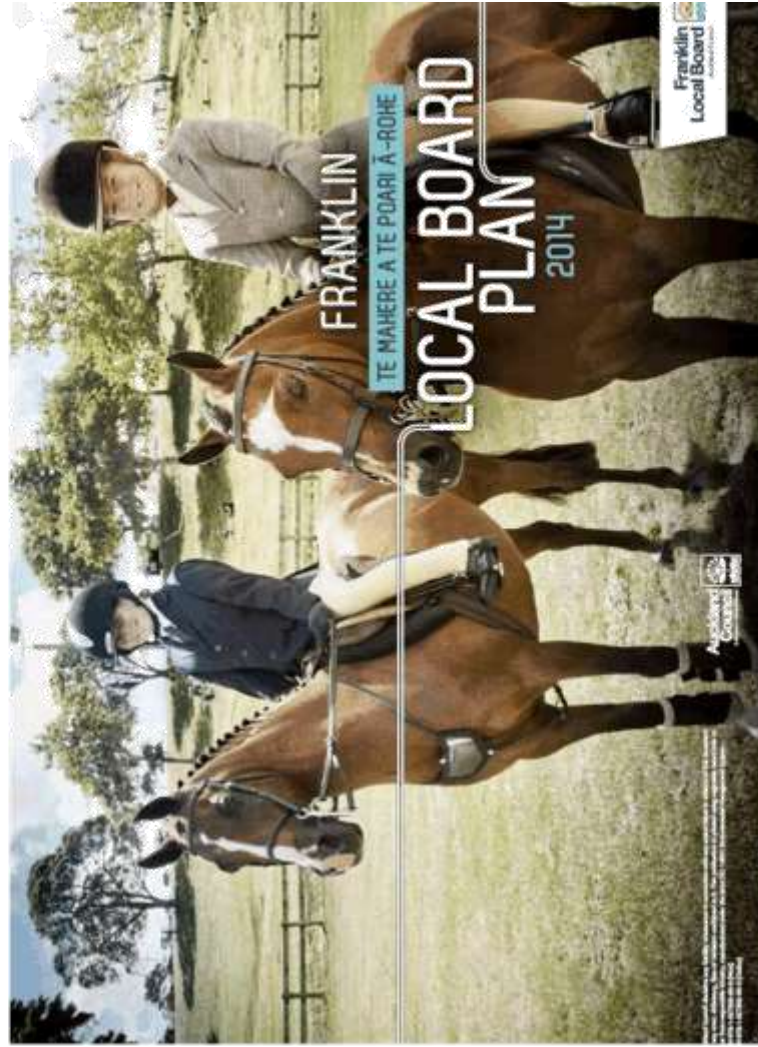

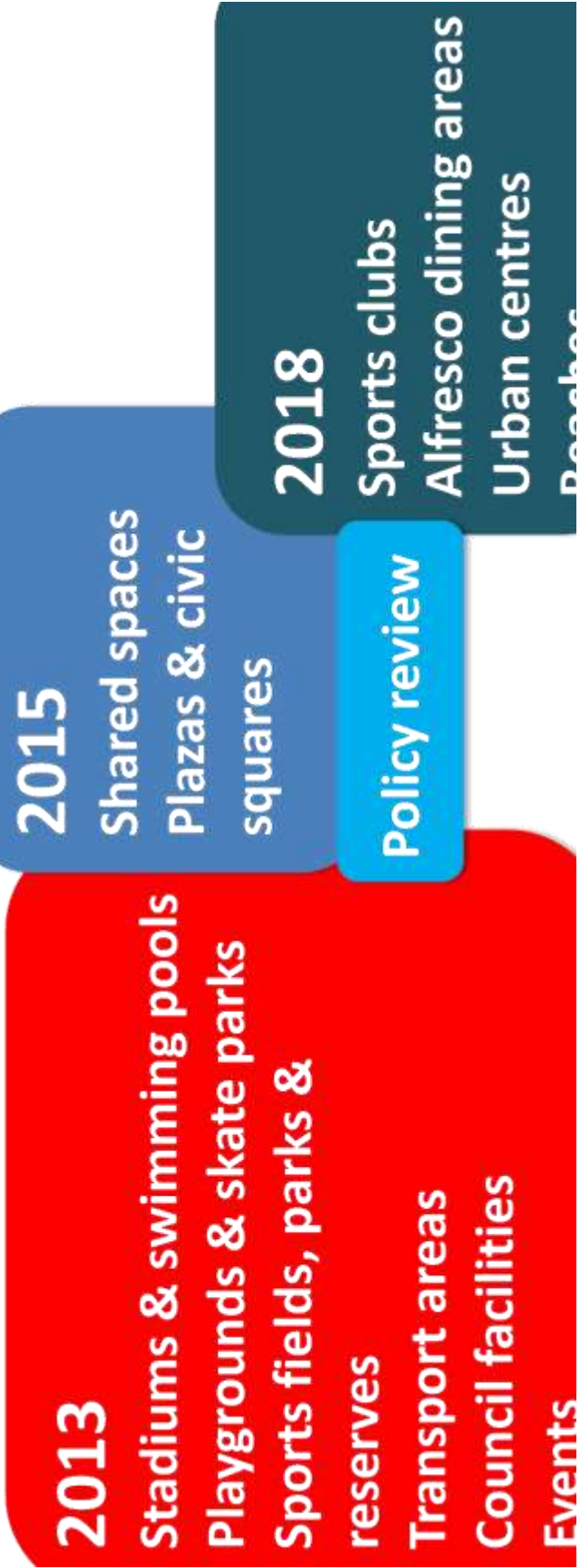
Community health

there is signage**



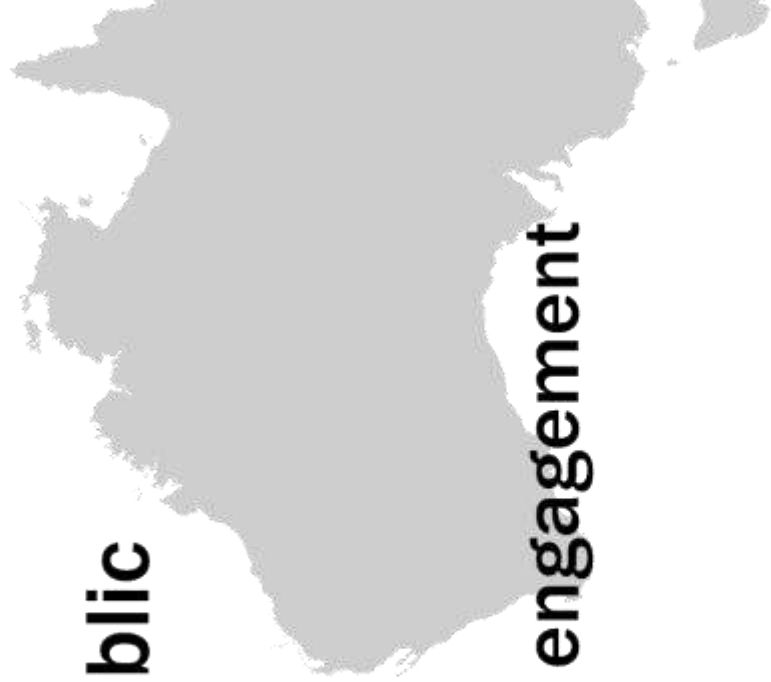
Australia – a decade of Smokefree bylaws



- Lots of SF public places
- High support from the public
- High compliance

Three differential factors:

- Wide communication and engagement before and on adoption
- Smokefree bylaws
- Smokefree in commercial arrangements



We can do this in Auckland



**Strong justification for a bylaw
in public places:**

- Where children go
- High density places
- Confined spaces

Smokefree requirements in:

- grants
- contracts
- leases
- licenses





Action is needed now to meet the 5% target

Auckland Council has a clear mandate for a stronger approach



WHAT CAN YOU DO?



require all local events to be Smokefree and ensure people know about it

Put Smokefree requirements into your **local board leases, contracts** and grants NOW

Ensure **budget is allocated** for local board and regional Smokefree implementation

Call for a **stronger nationwide policy** including bylaws, licenses, leases and contracts

Item 21 – additional information

Allocation of 2015/2016 Locally Driven Initiative Capital Fund and Community Response Fund

Since the report on the agenda was submitted, additional information has been received regarding two additional projects to be considered for funding through the community response fund. Both items were workshopped with the local board on 12 April 2016 and informal support for funding these was given by the board. It was expected that they could be funded through the Local Economic Development LDI budget. However as the work programme for growing the business performance in Clevedon/Wairoa has not yet been confirmed, it is recommended that the following two initiatives are funded by the community response fund:

Project	Cost	Details
Pukekohe High School careers expo	up to \$1000	Venue hire costs for the use of community facilities in Pukekohe, for the upcoming careers expo for all secondary schools in Franklin.
Tongzhou (China) visit	up to \$1000	Hosting a small delegation from Tongzhou. Discussions regarding a possible future relationship between Tongzhou District and Franklin Local Board (to be further considered through the local economic development work programme)
