

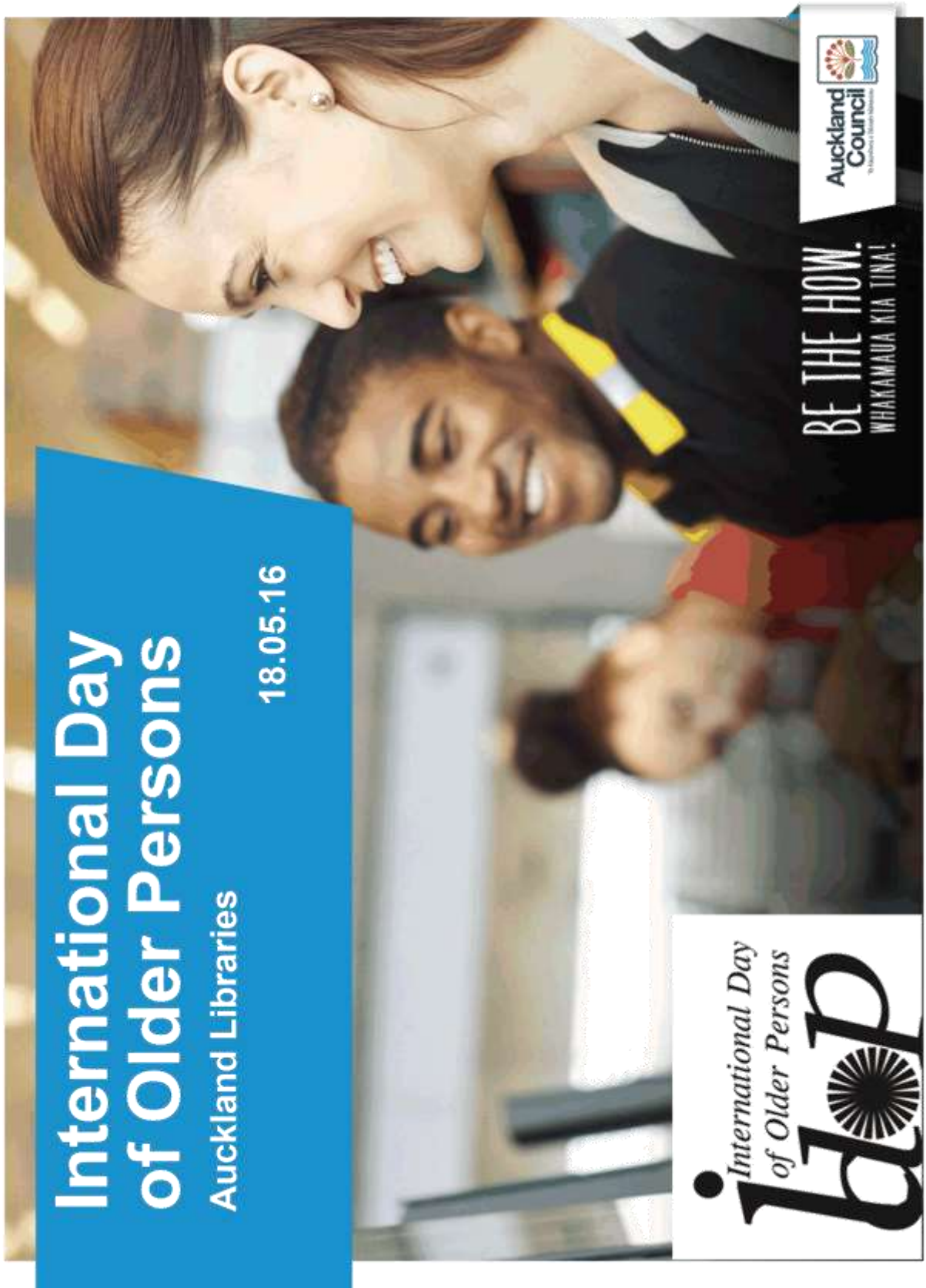

What Will Auckland Libraries Do?

The Living Storybook

- The chance for an intergenerational storytelling opportunity
- A daytime event where people or groups from different backgrounds and ages come together and answer some common questions about what your life was like at a certain age.
- These questions could include:
 - How did you communicate?
 - What was dating like?
 - What did you eat?
 - Where were the cool places to go?
 - What music did you listen to?
 - Who were the celebrities of the time?
 - What was the biggest news story of the time?
 - How did you get around?

What Will Auckland Libraries Do?

The Living Storybook

- Ideally a range of interest groups (PPAP & Networks), schools and the public would attend.
- The event would be facilitated in a world café style with large tables and lots of paper for writing and forming a 'living storybook'.
- Four different areas for the event (East, South, North, West)
- **Outcomes:**
 1. **Discussion, learning, intergenerational interaction**
 2. **Potential to create a 'Zine' or a large 'storybook'**
 3. **Oral history recordings – a set of questions for attendees to answer and record for an oral history record of the event.**
 4. **Template for further events like this.**
- Exciting, different, relevant, inclusive and as of yet, untested!
