

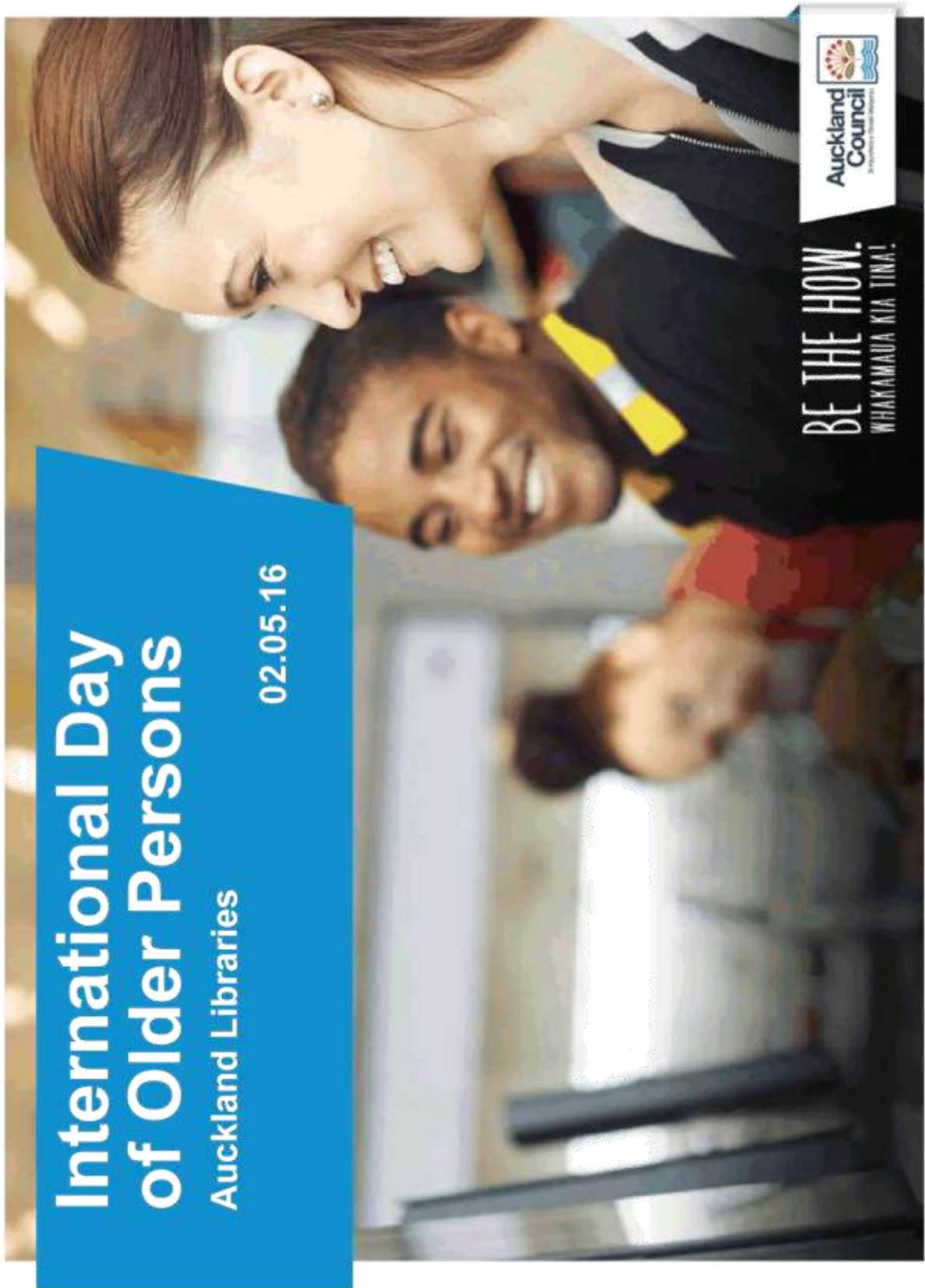

Part 3

The Living Storybook

- The chance for an intergenerational storytelling opportunity
- A daytime event where people or groups from different backgrounds and ages come together and answer some common questions about what your life was like at a certain age.
- These questions could include:

 - What did you eat?
 - Where were the cool places to go?
 - What music did you listen to?
 - Who were the celebrities of the time?
 - What was the biggest news story of the time?
 - How did you get around?

Part 3

The Living Storybook

- Ideally a range of interest groups, schools and the public would attend.
- The event would be facilitated in a world café style with large tables and lots of paper for writing and forming a 'living storybook'.
- **Outcomes:**
 1. **Discussion, learning, intergenerational interaction**
 2. **Potential to create a 'Zine' or a large 'storybook'**
 3. **Oral history recordings – a set of questions for attendees to answer and record for an oral history record of the event.**
 4. **Template for further events like this.**

HAVE BEEN ACHIEVED IN OUR AGREED PRIORITY AREAS OF WORK....**

INCLUSIVENESS

- greater demonstrated commitment to **IDOP** by AC
- evidence (qualitative, quantitative) of **positive imaging** of seniors by AC (internal and external communications)
- communication plan - **cultural participation** (linkages/ database etc) Kaumatua / Other ethnicities

HOUSING

- Seniors Housing Action Plan (10 years) in place
- Universal Design in DNA of AC and PDA (mandatory requirements)

AGE-FRIENDLY CITIES

- Letter of intent sent by AC to WHO re formal participation

TRANSPORT

- Accessibility Action Plan in place by AT

HEALTH AND SAFETY

- Elder Abuse Action Plan (Multi -sector) in place for Auckland
- Safe Communities accreditation mandated
