Have your say – Naming of road provisionally known as Glenvar Ridge Road

Auckland Transport (AT) would like your feedback on the proposed new names for the new road provisionally known as Glenvar Ridge Road. The road is currently under construction and is expected to be ready in 2018.

The new road will extend from opposite the Long Bay Baptist Church in Glenvar Road to the western boundary of the lower Long Bay development site. It will provide a direct route to the Long Bay area and an easier alternative access to Long Bay Regional Park.

The new road will also divert traffic away from the existing heavily urbanised and constrained roads in Torbay, especially during the summer season when there is a significant increase in visitors to the regional park and Torbay village, and improve access to a number of properties along the route.

Proposed names

Following engagement with local iwi the following names are currently under consideration;

Option 1 - **Te Ara Piki Kaka Road** – This translates to climb the ridge or ridgeline.

Option 2 - **Maramatanga Road** – This translates to enlightenment or understanding.

Option 3 - **Hiringa Huanui Road** – This translates to pathway of inspiration.

Option 4 - **Glenvar Ridge Road**.
