<p>Key Stakeholder meeting</p> <p>Shelvin Munif-Imo Local Board Engagement Advisor</p>	<p>Information dissemination</p>	<p>The Chairperson gave an overview of the projects the board has been working on.</p> <p>The stakeholders raised the following points and concerns:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A need for regular transport loop services to transport hubs and shopping centres. • Manurewa train station needs to be gated – at least 50% of Manurewa users are not paying for their public transport usage. • Manurewa needs shops people want to come to. • Window washers – The bylaw needs to have an enforcement clause that enables the Police to issue tickets and deal with window washers at the time. At the moment the Police cannot do

The Police advise don't pay the window washers.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Health and transport are important to older people. • Businesses have been impacted with the buses no longer stopping on Great South Road. • A business owner was threatened by people sleeping outside the business. Report any incidents to the Police. • Homelessness – sometimes it wasn't a homeless issue. It was accessing support services to help people access entitlements. People don't seem to know who or how to ask for help. • There is a need to be vigilant against thinking being poor is a crime. • There is a need to work on ways to encourage community empowerment so people can connect and develop. • There is work out there – people have to want to find it. Sarah Leyland provided the following link to a website designed to help people (particularly young people) find employment: www.joybusinessacademy.com • A drivers licence is a necessity to find work. • The churches in Manurewa started the "House of Hope". A drop in centre has been established in Southmall. • Christmas in the park – 10 December. • Manukau New Life church has purchased the land that runs along the railway line up to Jellicoe Park. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • They will build a couple of houses for short term housing for those struggling with accommodation. • The church also want to buld a performing arts cente. • The current auditorium will then become a youth centre. • Two new pastors in the community replacing Rev Mark Beale. • Morning tea from 10.30am to 12noon at the Methodist Church. Would like to be able to offer a paid position for a kitchen supervisor and someone who can pick up on issues.
