Lower Priority Areas	Description
The board will give applications lower priority and less favourable consideration if they contain one or more of the following:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ongoing administration costs including salaries • Ticketed events, commercial events or events that promote a brand or company • Catering costs • Applications for activities taking place outside the local board area.
The Otara-Papatoetoe Local Board has also identified the following financial situation of an applicant, as a lower priority for funding:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Applicant that are making no financial contribution of their own to the project • Applicant has not considered other sources of funding for their project
In addition to the eligibility criteria outlined the Community Grants Policy, the Otara-Papatoetoe Local Board will not fund:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • applicants who failed to provide accountability forms from a previous funding allocation • applicants who provided unsatisfactory accountability forms from a previous funding allocation.

Investment approach

The Otara-Papatoetoe Local Board has allocated budgets to support the local grants programme as follows:

- Quick Response Local Grants:
 - Minimum amount per grant: \$500
 - Maximum amount per grant: \$2,000
- Local Grants: as per annual plan/local board agreement
- Discretionary Grants: as per annual plan/local board agreement
