Re: Western Springs Stadium surrounds TEMPORARY ALCOHOL BAN

The purpose of this letter is to submit to the Council a formal request from the Auckland City Police for temporary Alcohol Ban in the external environs for the following concert at Western Springs Stadium:

- 4 February 2017 – Guns and Roses Concert, 40,000 patrons expected

The introduction of temporary liquor bans around Western Springs Stadium in recent years has curbed the activity of pre loading by patrons gathered in the vicinity of the stadium. In past events this has proven an effective tool for the management of anti-social behaviour arising from some individuals who would otherwise become intoxicated and disruptive, and thereby spoiling the enjoyment of others. The use of a temporary liquor ban is a proportionate response to the problem and assists police controlling the amount of alcohol being consumed in the environ of the event, through pre and side loading, as well as reducing the incidence of alcohol related offending due to high levels of intoxication.

This proposal supports the NZ Police Prevention First operational strategy by reducing the ability of problem groups to consume alcohol in the general vicinity of the event. This reduces the levels of intoxication that can lead to alcohol related offending.

The Auckland City District Police therefore formally request that the Auckland Council implement a Liquor Ban from 0600 hrs on the Saturday 4 February 2017 to 0600hrs Sunday 5 February 2017 for the Guns and Roses Concert in the following streets and reserves:

- Western Springs Lakeside, Western Springs Outer Fields, Motions Road, Bullock Track, Old Mill Road, West View Road, Stadium Road Sherwood Avenue, Stanmore Road, Wilson Road, Ivanhoe Road, Rona Road, Sefton Street, Castle Street Sefton Road, Francis Street, Wexford Road, Browning Street, Selbourne Street Firth Road, Tuarangi Road, Tay Road, Herringson Avenue, Barrington Road, Gilbert Avenue, Shirley Road, Myrtle Street, Levonia Street, that part of Great North Road between Bond Street and the permanent all hours alcohol controls already in place on that road at the Grey Lynn Town Centre, Premier Avenue and that part of Great North Road between Motions Road and the permanent all hours alcohol controls already in place on that road at the Grey Lynn Town Centre
