Local Board Plan 2017-2020	Setting direction, priorities and budgets	To discuss initial ideas of board members on options for the structure and content of the new local board plan.

## Summary of Discussions

### Outcome: A heart for Manukau

- Comments: Outcomes are hard to measure as they are broad ideas; Consider previous Manukau ideas i.e. a face of Manukau; ask Panuku Development Auckland for assistance
- Words: Use Transform Manukau but it is a growth area; a beating heart for Manukau, gateway to Manukau, second largest city, is the thriving heart. Objective - include metropolitan
- Keep outcome refresh outcome and objectives text

### Outcome: Town centre vitality

- Keep outcome, including the 'town centre' wording
- Comments: Homeless and prostitution getting worse, Donna wants to focus on local economy, safety is another focus area including CCTV
- Wording to be considered partnerships/opportunities to highlight to the community on the board's intent to support local economy in reference to BIDS
- Lotu's idea is that town centres are hubs where different activities occur including economics

<p><b>Outcome: Parks and Facilities</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Keep outcome.</li> <li>• Comments: Less green space in Papatoetoe. Advocate keeping green spaces and upgrading facilities, protect Papatoetoe green space from having facilities built on them, agree to maximise local facilities to capacity and to share facilities.</li> <li>• Promote other wordings like Parks and Facilities that enhances people's wellbeing.</li> </ul> <p><b>Outcome: Healthy Harbours and waterways</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Keep outcome</li> <li>• Comments: It is ongoing as Otago Waterways &amp; Lake is 30 years plan and Puhinui Stream is 20 years plan. It is important to educate the next generation. Tougher penalties, stricter enforcement for pollution for industries. Protect the birds and other living creatures along the waterways and coastlines. Encourage community ownership of the surrounding areas to care for the environment; look at including coastal areas like the Manukau Harbour and adopt a coastline.</li> <li>• Consider other wording in particular the kaitiaki model to environment; teaching, learning, accountability, council need more people to enforce bylaws.</li> <li>• Wording: sustainable, prevention.</li> </ul> <p><b>Outcome: Thriving communities</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Keep outcome</li> <li>• Comment: outcome doesn't explain enough of what it means; Donna explained the Puhinui event where people want to be involved in community events like clean ups; agree that more capacity is needed, this will include establishing council advisors to support community groups at community meetings.</li> <li>• Words: empowered, inclusive, prosperous communities.</li> <li>• Objectives - safety, capacity building, inclusiveness.</li> </ul> <p><b>Outcome: Age friendly community</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Keep outcome but separate wording rangatahi (youth) and senior citizens (kamatua).</li> <li>• Objectives – focus on youth development and valuing and supporting our seniors.</li> <li>• Words: elderly in the objective; use Maori translation of youth/senior citizen</li> </ul> <p><b>Outcome: Transport</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Drop outcome</li> <li>• Comment: Advocate to extend Manukau trains to further south, support Mangere-Otahuhu Local Board to advocate for more funding to have light rail to the airport.</li> </ul> <p>Newsletter to inform locals of the board activities; talk to comms to understand costs of newsletter drops versus advertising in the local paper</p>
