Timber boardwalk/platforms project the visitor out into the Orbwa estuary and environment, while revealing the natural forces of the wetlands.

- 1 Create an entrance/feature into the reserve to highlight and encourage visitors into the reserve.
- 2 Create Community Art Centre, with paved spaces for community gatherings, sculpture display and outdoor cinema.
- 3 Existing information kiosk. Vegetation removed to increase visibility into the reserve from Hibiscus Coast Highway and enable the reserve to become a vehicle gateway feature for Orwa.
- 4 Remove existing sewerage infrastructure.
- 5 Existing pedestrian enhanced and reinforced with feature uplighting to reinforce gateway feature into Orwa. Resign street topography to reveal under the canopy of the porohorua.
- 6 Orwa Bowling club - additional bowling green to the west of the clubhouse. A future development plan is to be completed to enhance the design of this area including consideration for consolidation of parking, boundary treatment and late building footprints.
- 7 Hibiscus Coast Youth Centre
- 8 Existing playground to be upgraded.
- 9 Orwa Lions Club (inc ball trap) to be removed to improve the safety and visibility to the coastal walkway.
- 10 Hibiscus Dog Obstacle and exercise area north of clubhouse.
- 11 Timber platform allows access to the estuary for potential activities associated with the Youth Centre such as kayaking and canoeing
- 12 Stone gabion bridge - suitable location, extent & design to be determined in consultation with landscape architect & engineer.
- 13 Terrace platform/stepping stone for outdoor performance events.
- 14 Timber platform provides open views out to the Orwa estuary with potential to be a quiet space amongst the mangroves.
- 15 Timber interpretation/environmental platform underneath the canopy of existing porohorua, a quiet space amongst the mangroves.
- 16 Boardwalk/bridge connection to Orwa College through the mangroves.
- 17 "Story-walk" feature, possible timber posts set into ground with island stories of interpretation.
- 18 The ground level composition of the existing interpretation display. Potential to be an environment for children to explore water quality, water movement and the importance of sustainable planting.
- 19 Interchange platform provides a point of view to increase visibility into the reserve. Large building provides a secondary play area into the reserve on story level.
- 20 Removal of existing stone entrance street bridge and opens up views into the reserve.
- 21 Push back entry highlight the original coastline prior to reclamation.
- 22 Two separate potential points of private (top) along Catterway Road to increase visibility into the reserve.
- 23 Existing Hibiscus Coast Community House and create building relocated to the same opposite the former (m) golf area to increase visibility and improve connectivity into the reserve from Catterway Road.
