Acquisition of part properties is still on-going.</p> <p>Mill Road is a priority in 10 year project plan.</p> <p>Issues around funding so working with AT, NZTA and other agencies.</p> <p>Orams Road</p> <p>AT are looking to update the board on the wider southern corridor in March 2017.</p> <p>The Orams Road Bridge will close in April. The pedestrian walkway from Orams Road to the Botanic Gardens will stay open.</p> <p>Bus routes will be affected.</p> <p>The communications plan includes letter drops (3 weeks prior), print advertising, on-line Herald, social media, electronic signage etc.</p> <p>Residents will be notified of the nights work will be undertaken. It is safer to work at night as there is less traffic but it may be noisy for residents.</p> <p>The board raised the concern of added traffic pressures and congestion on Great South Road while the project is being done. There may be a need to change the traffic light phasing on Great South / Hill Road / Station Road area to stop the build up of traffic.</p> <p>Action</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Jenni to ensure Angela is kept informed of mana whenua hui, who is representing the boards and the outcome of hui. 2. AT and NZTA to include Maori radio station, contact local Pacific and Indian community groups, Hill Road Residents' Association, Ken Penney's barber shop window in the Communications Plan. 3. Board members to communicate the information about the Orams Road Bridge through their networks.

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<p>Friends of Auckland Botanic Gardens - Sculpture in the Gardens</p> <p>Kim Stretton, Event Manager</p> <p>Jack Hobbs, Manager Botanic Gardens</p>	<p>Keeping informed</p>	<p>Jack Hobbs provided the board with an overview of funding required to deliver on the Sculpture in the Gardens event.</p> <p>There are currently 21 significant sculptures located in and around the Botanic Gardens with a further 13 spaces identified that could house sculptures.</p> <p>Next Sculpture in the Gardens event is scheduled for November 2017. The theme will be mentoring young emerging artists and taking into account diverse cultures.</p> <p>Artists will be chosen in March 2017. Each artist is given a contribution to help with creating their artwork.</p> <p>Overflow Car Park</p> <p>Main car park allows for 174 car parks.</p> <p>Funding has been approved for an “all purpose” overflow car park for 200 vehicles.</p> <p>Actions</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Sarah Colcord and the Manurewa Youth Council to meet with Jack about further projects that they could work on together. 2. Is there scope for an exhibition of Manurewa Maori history at the gardens? Can we consider funds from the events budget for an event?
