Student Leadership Breakfast: Event Evaluation

Friday 3rd March | 9:00am – 10:30am | Manurewa Marae

In attendance: Approx. 50 James Cook High School, Manurewa High School & Alfriston College students

Purpose: With one of our priorities being to build stronger connections with our local High Schools, the Student Leadership Breakfast was an opportunity for us to introduce who we are and what we do, and also a chance for students to tell us what issues they are currently facing and what events/projects/initiatives they would like to see from us this year.

What went well?

- Energetic, focused and engaged MYC team
- Good turnout of engaged students who provided great ideas
- Budget was met
- Students were happy with the food, speakers and opportunity to meet students from other schools
- MYC has a better idea of what events youth want to see in Manurewa

What could be improved?

- More engagement from the MYC team at the beginning of the event (e.g. introducing themselves at the start)
- Run-sheet times - Miscalculated the cooking time. However, this was mitigated by switching the programme around.
- Paying more attention to roles/responsibilities as there were often empty work-stations (e.g. Registration table)
- Communication
 - Communication within the sub-committee
 - In the future, a RACI template will be included in the Event Plan so that communication is clear and stakeholders are established.
 - Communication to the schools
 - In the future, we hope to have a presence from South Auckland Middle School and Te Wharekura O Manurewa


