We have over 1200 toys for hire. If these are broken, our toy repairer repairs them and then they get recirculated. We have toys in our Toy Library which are 20 years old (still being hired from when we began in 1996). Toys can be hired for up to 2 weeks before they are returned and then can be hired out to another family. So toys can be hired and used by up to 20 different families in one year (we are closed for approx. 6 weeks for stocktake and annual shutdown).</p> <p>The tractor and pedal trike are toys that allow children to learn hands on, and provide great exercise for toddlers.</p>
