Harbour Sport, Toni Maree Carnie and Kevin O’Leary	Harbour Sport, outlining the activities of this organisation in the Rodney Local Board area	Ms Carnie and Mr O’Leary outlined the activities and initiatives of Harbour Sport in the Rodney Local Board area. The local board acknowledged the important role Harbour Sport plays in the community across a wide range of sporting codes.
Matakana Community Group, Dr Simon Barclay and Murray Wallace	Matakana Community Group, various issues and initiatives	Dr Barclay and Mr Wallace gave a presentation on some of the issues facing Matakana including increased traffic, parking, drainage and footpaths. The representatives also outlined some of the initiatives the community has aspirations for such as Tamahunga foot bridge, an inner village cycleway, parking at the school and tennis courts and a pump track at Diamond Jubilee Park as well as improvements to Matakana Valley Road. The local board noted that many of the issues were primarily the responsibility of Auckland Transport, and the council’s Healthy Waters team. The local board will encourage the community group to make submissions to the annual budget and local board plan.
Helensville Community Recycling Centre, Treena Gowthorpe and supporters	Helensville Community Recycling Centre, outlining the initiatives and activities of this organisation	Ms Gowthorpe outlined the initiatives and activities of the Helensville Community Recycling Centre which operates from a site in Mill Road, Helensville. Since the centre transitioned to a full recycling centre in the first year of the new contract growth and revenue was higher than projected. Staff levels have increased and a diversion rate of 70% achieved. In addition the centre is an important place for people to connect. The centre has plans for expansion, dependent on land owned by Panuku Development Auckland. The local board applauded the efforts of the recycling centre.
North West Sustainability Centre Project, Kyle Parker		Mr Parker outlined the proposal for a sustainability centre and “hub” for the Kumeu-Riverhead area to encourage the community let live more health, holistic and sustainable lives.

Land at Woodcocks Road, Jonathan Chen on behalf of Sunnyvale Manor		Mr Chen gave a presentation on a proposal for Sunnyvale Manor, a company which owns a forest in Woodcocks Road, to purchase six small council owned parcels of land, created some years ago as a realignment of Woodcocks Road. The matter will be the subject of a report to the local board from Panuku Development Auckland which will seek the local board's views before a further report is presented to the Finance and Performance Committee of the governing body for a decision regarding disposal.
Snells Beach skate park, June Turner		Ms Turner spoke in support of an upgrade of the skate park at Snells Beach. She also requested that if the local board approve to allocate budget towards upgrading the skate parks in Snells Beach and Wellsford, which they did later in the meeting, that some of the money go towards painting and graffiti proofing the fence at Snells Beach.

Lance Hessell, Terra Nova Planning	Proposed 80 lot subdivision at Wellsford and the proposal to vest two lots in council for reserve purposes.	Mr Hessell outlined a proposed 80 lot subdivision in Wellsford and the developer's offer to vest two lots in council for public open space purposes. The lot sizes do not align with the council's Open Space Provision Policy and it would be the responsibility of the local board to maintain those parcels of land. The matter was considered by the Environment and Community Committee in December and a further report will come to the local board on this matter in due course.
