We propose to focus on five outcomes. Our plan is based on the feedback and ideas you have given us.

1. A strong local economy

(IMG 38-278383)

To support a strong local economy we will work with partners on:

- growing our green economy and eco-tourism
- increasing the employment prospects of young people
- implementing projects from centre plans for Silverdale, Ōrewa, Browns Bay and Whangaparāoa
- developing local centre plans for Mairangi Bay, Red Beach, Waiwera and Rothesay Bay
- creating pedestrian-friendly shared space at Inverness Road, Browns Bay and Main Street in Whangaparāoa.

2. Connected communities with excellent transport choices

We will do our part to influence efficient transport connections and infrastructure by:

- advocating for the construction of Penlink to be brought forward
- developing and improving walking and cycling routes including safe crossings
- advocating for more transport options and improved linkages
- advocating for the East Coast Road extension to Curley Avenue which will improve access to Silverdale Street.

3. Access to recreation choices and open space

We want to encourage people to be healthy and active, and enjoy quality recreation and open space. We will support this by:

- Advocating for funding in the council's 10-year budget to deliver part of the Ōrewa Beach Esplanade Enhancement Plan
- implementing the Mairangi Bay Reserves Concept Plan and reviewing other reserve management plans
- Ensuring park facilities are suitable for a range of family-friendly activities
- Partnering with organisations able to develop sport and recreation infrastructure for projects such as Freyberg Park, Browns Bay and Metro Park East, Silverdale
- Prioritising the development of walkways and cycleways in the Hibiscus and Bays Greenways (Local Paths) Plan.
