## **WHAT WE PROPOSE TO FOCUS ON**

We plan to focus on seven outcomes. Each has a selection of key initiatives, some of which deliver on multiple outcomes. Our plan is based on the feedback and ideas that you have given us over the last three years.

### **Outcome 1. Our people identify Kaipātiki as their papakāinga (place to stand)**

It is important that you have a sense of belonging, connection to one another and pride in your communities. We will support this by:

- partnering with you to expand local place-making initiatives
- developing smarter ways of engaging with you to increase participation in local decision-making
- encouraging and supporting local events that celebrate our area's diversity and identity
- working alongside Panuku Development Auckland, Hobsonville Land Company, other stakeholders and you to support the successful and inclusive redevelopment of Northcote.

### **Outcome 2. Our natural environment is protected for future generations to enjoy**

To ensure our coastline, green spaces and waterways are enjoyed, enhanced and protected for future generations, we plan to:

- improve access to our various reserves, parks and beaches with better tracks and signage
- deliver on our Pest Free Kaipātiki Strategy by encouraging collaboration between the council, volunteers and wider community to eradicate plant and animal pests
- support local initiatives for improving stream and harbour water quality.

### **Outcome 3. Our people are active and healthy**

To support our people to make healthy lifestyle choices, we will work on:

- the Kaipātiki Connections Network Plan – a plan to improve and extend walking and cycling links between our schools, town centres, reserves and coastline
- improving the quality of our leisure and recreational facilities
- ensuring our parks and reserves offer a range of activities and facilities for all ages and abilities
- encouraging and supporting a range of events that celebrate our diversity.

#### **Outcome 4. Getting to and around Kaipātiki is easy**

We will improve local transport options and infrastructure and ease congestion by:

- spending more of our transport budget on local walking and cycling infrastructure and public transport infrastructure
- advocating for Auckland Transport to increase funding for walking and cycling projects in Kaipātiki
- continuing to advocate to Auckland Transport for further improvements to bus and ferry services.

#### **Outcome 5. Our urban centres are vibrant**

To support our villages, town centres and business areas in attracting visitors and providing increased local employment, we plan to:

- update current plans and advocate to the governing body for centre improvement funding for Glenfield to improve streetscapes and public spaces
- implement small infrastructure improvements, such as improved signage and public seating
- support place-making initiatives and local events in village centres, such as Beach Haven and other smaller precincts
- continue supporting our Business Improvement Districts in Birkenhead and Northcote to help them meet growing local and visitor needs
- work towards using social procurement policies on our contracts to give priority to local businesses and workers
- address safety-related issues that act as a barrier for people accessing and enjoying our villages, town centres and business areas.

## **Outcome 6. Our community facilities and infrastructure are high quality and well managed**

To ensure our community facilities are well maintained, accessible and continue to meet your needs, we will:

- use board funding to improve maintenance, renewals and access to our sport and recreation facilities, reserves and parks
- work with other facility owners, such as schools and sports clubs, to improve and increase community access and opportunities
- develop a smarter way of engaging with you so your views can better inform our decision-making
- ensure our libraries are meeting your needs in their role as community hubs.

## **Outcome 7. Services are well managed and meet community needs**

To provide you with relevant, high quality community services and events, we will:

- support community partners with some operational funding and training to deliver the programmes and services you're seeking
- support and encourage events that celebrate our diverse community, our identity and sustainable living
- work with community partners to ensure facilities are fit-for-purpose, well-maintained and future proofed for growth.
