The key feedback included: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - General support for five concepts as presented - Biggest issues, transport, wellness and housing - Shuttle service to tie the three centres together and possibly Bruce Pulman Park - More clean and accessible areas - Make areas accessible and 'age friendly' - Destination shops needed in Manurewa and Papakura - Need more visibility of older people in council documents and plans - Easier and safer accessibility for pedestrians
