Below is an overview of the four outcomes we are proposing to focus on. Our plan is based on the feedback and ideas that our community has given to us.

1. Maungakiekie-Tāmaki is an active and engaged community

We believe that a community is made stronger, safer and a better place to live, when we come together and participate, celebrate our different cultures and create opportunities for our young people.

For our community to be active and engaged we will concentrate our efforts on:

- Reducing the number of local youth not in education, employment or training (NEET), by working with partners such as Youth Connections, schools, including tertiary institutions, and training providers
- Encouraging initiatives that bring community together and celebrate diversity by supporting and providing community education, and enhancing relationships with local social services
- Making our community feel safe by using best practice environmental design in community spaces, work with Police and other government agencies to discourage anti-social behaviour and prevent crime

2. Maungakiekie-Tāmaki is a community that cares about its environment

You told us that addressing environmental issues is very important to you, accordingly we will:

- Improve environmental outcomes by working together with our communities, iwi and industry to ensure our waterways, harbour and estuary are healthy and accessible
- Advocate to Watercare for investment in addressing coastal erosion, and to ensure flood mitigation plans complement the naturalisation of streams so they are more than just stormwater and overflow channels
- Support waste minimisation initiatives and work towards a reduction in chemical spraying as preventative measures for the health of our environment
- Advocate to the governing body for investment in coastal protection to address coastal erosion issues

3. Maungakiekie-Tāmaki is the place to be

We want to ensure that we attract people to live, work, play and stay in the Maungakiekie-Tāmaki area. To do this we will ensure that:

- New developments are high-quality and reflect the flavour and character of our area by advocating and working with Panuku Development Auckland, developers and housing providers especially in Glen Innes, Panmure and Onehunga

- Actively promote and attract key players to the area to add value to our town centres and business areas

4. Maungakiekie-Tāmaki has quality infrastructure to match growth

We will do our part to make excellent transport connections and infrastructure a reality by:

- Ensuring our community benefits from large-scale transformation and development by advocating for high-quality social infrastructure as part of transformation projects
- Creating better connections across our area by supporting and developing cycleways through our local parks, and by advocating for more park-n-ride facilities and better connected public transport options
- Work with Auckland Transport to ensure they are responsive to community needs and minimise disruption to town centres and residential areas during a time of rapid development
