FROM THE CHAIR

I am pleased to present this summary of our draft Ōtara-Papatoetoe Local Board Plan 2017.

Auckland is facing many challenges and local boards cannot expect to receive all the funding we would like, so we must make choices. Our plan represents what we think are the most urgent and worthwhile projects.

Having secured funding for the new multi-sport and marae complex at Ngāti Ōtara Park and to refurbish Te Puke o Tara Community Centre, we are keen to ensure these projects are delivered in 2018.

We will need to advocate for funding in the Long-term Plan for the proposed new changing room and toilet block on Kingswood Reserve, a playground at Hayman Park and an artificial sports surface at Papatoetoe Recreation Reserve.

You've also told us you want to see improvements to town centres, parks and facilities, a clean-up of Ōtara Lake, and a range of social issues addressed, including youth unemployment, and reducing the harmful effect on our community from alcohol and gambling.

Our plan identifies seven broad outcomes as well as priorities we propose to focus on over the next three years, some of which you have shared with us in the past.

Together we can achieve great things for Ōtara-Papatoetoe.

WHAT WE PROPOSE TO FOCUS ON

We propose to focus on seven outcomes which take note of the feedback and ideas you have given us over time.

1. Manukau transformation

The centre of Manukau will be the thriving heart of our area, attracting business and visitors. It will be a great place to work, live and enjoy. We will play our part by:

- partnering with Panuku Development Auckland (Panuku) to reposition
 Manukau as a centre for education and business innovation
- improving walking routes between Manukau Square, transport centres,
 Hayman Park and public facilities
- advocate for Manukau Sports Bowl to become an athletics sports centre
- updating development plans for Hayman Park to support the vision to include Te Papa Manukau, a destination playground, and a war memorial garden for Pacific soldiers
- creating more public events and activities to attract locals and visitors.

2. Revitalising town centres

We want Ōtara, Old Papatoetoe and Hunter's Corner town centres to be busy and vibrant hubs of our community. We will contribute to this by:

- partnering with business associations to improve public safety and supporting community events
- funding celebration of Hunter's Corner's diverse cultures
- partnering with Panuku to revitalise the old Papatoetoe town centre
- supporting arts and culture activities to make Ōtara the music and arts centre
 of Auckland
- encouraging businesses to create local employment opportunities
- advocating to the governing body for funding to:
 - redevelop Sutton Crescent/Great South Road corner to improve visibility and connectivity with local sports facilities and Hunter's Corner shops
 - o redesign entrances to Ōtara Library and Ōtara Music and Arts Centre.

3. Parks and facilities meet people's needs

We want you to live healthy and active lifestyles, so we will ensure you have access to quality parks and facilities by:

- completing the refresh of Papatoetoe Chambers and refurbishment of Te
 Puke o Tara Community Centre
- advocating to the governing body to fund:
 - a new toilet block/changing rooms at Kingswood Reserve, Papatoetoe,
 and at Te Puke o Otara Sports Park
 - o new artificial playing surface at Papatoetoe Recreation Reserve
- partnering with Auckland Transport to prioritise and allocate funding for routes identified in the Ōtara- Papatoetoe Greenways Plan (now called Local Paths).

4. Healthy natural environment

A healthy natural environment, free of litter, pests and pollution is important to us, so we'll focus on:

- improving water quality in streams, the Manukau Harbour and Tāmaki Estuary
- promoting the vision of the Otara Lakes and Waterways Trust and planting projects along the banks of Ōtara Lake/Creek, Puhinui Stream and Hayman Park

- working in partnership with other local boards advocating to the governing body for funding to establish a southern resource recovery network
- raising community awareness about pest plants and animals.

5. Empowered, inclusive and prosperous communities

We want you to feel welcome, safe and proud of your area, to support each other. We will encourage this by focusing on:

- celebrating the heritage and cultural diversity with funding of public art initiatives
- · establishing an ethnic diversity forum and a diversity festival at Hayman Park
- providing advice how to influence decision-makers on social issues as harm from alcohol and gambling
- encouraging businesses to employ local people, particularly on large local infrastructure projects
- promoting health and wellbeing by continuing free access to our swimming pools, funded through a local targeted rate (currently \$29 per household).

6. Honouring youth and seniors

We will work with businesses, tourism operators and other council organisations to:

- promote youth participation in employment, education, training and business,
 and youth leadership
- · continue funding Youth Connections and activities that promote excellence
- ensure seniors have access to quality facilities, resources and activities
- continue funding the Otara Skills Shed and establish a Papatoetoe Skills shed.

7. It's easy to get around

It is important that our community can travel easily across the area and the region, on foot or by bike, car, bus and train, so our focus is to:

 Work with Auckland Transport to improve footpaths, pedestrian and bike routes and build more bus shelters and to realign the intersection at Preston/Ormiston and East Tamaki roads

- advocate to Auckland Transport and the governing body for a light rail link to the airport
- advocate to the governing body to double annual level of the Local Boards
 Transport Capital Fund to \$20m.
