MĀORI TRANSFORMATIONAL SHIFT ACTIVITIES DEFINITIONS

Te Toa Takitini oversees four programmes of transformational activities:

Whai Rawa – Māori economic well-being:

To significantly lift Māori economic well-being and enable and contribute to Māori economic needs and aspirations through activities that target tribal development, whānau well-being, and Māori business sector development.

Whai Painga – Māori social well-being

To significantly lift Māori social well-being and enable and contribute to Māori social needs and aspirations through activities that target mana whenua, mataawaka, whānau well-being and Māori social sector organisations.

Whai Tiaki – Māori cultural well-being:

To significantly lift Māori cultural well-being and enable mana whenua involvement in the stewardship and kaitiakitanga of natural resources through activities that target mana whenua, mataawaka, whānau well-being, taurahere organisations, and Māori cultural sector organisations.

Whai Tika – Effectiveness for Māori:

To significantly lift the council's performance and relationships with Māori by transforming the council group's culture, thinking and practises through activities that target decision-makers, departments and council controlled organisations (CCOs).

Māori sites of significance

Improving the identification, mapping, protection and management of sites of significance to mana whenua.

Beneath Our Feet

The objective of “Beneath our feet” is to support mana whenua to tell the stories of Tāmaki Makaurau in a range of innovative formats, linking digital and physical interpretation of histories of place.

Māori Cultural Initiatives Fund

Contestable funding for marae and papakāinga.

Te Herenga Waka Festival

An annual event over three days of traditional and contemporary Māori culture, that includes performances from emerging and established Māori musicians, as well as Auckland's top kapa haka groups.
