Every child deserves to grow up in a healthy community free from gambling harm. We want Auckland to be a vibrant and healthy community for our children to grow up in. Pokies are not part of the future we want for our children. Our most vulnerable children are exposed to pokies more than other children. When parents have problems with gambling, it is often children who suffer most and they are more likely to become problem gamblers themselves. We can break that cycle by saying No to more pokies and choosing a healthier future for our children.

About the campaign

This campaign for a 'sinking lid' for Auckland is being led by providers of problem gambling services in partnership with a range of other organisations who are concerned about the impact of problem gambling on our communities.

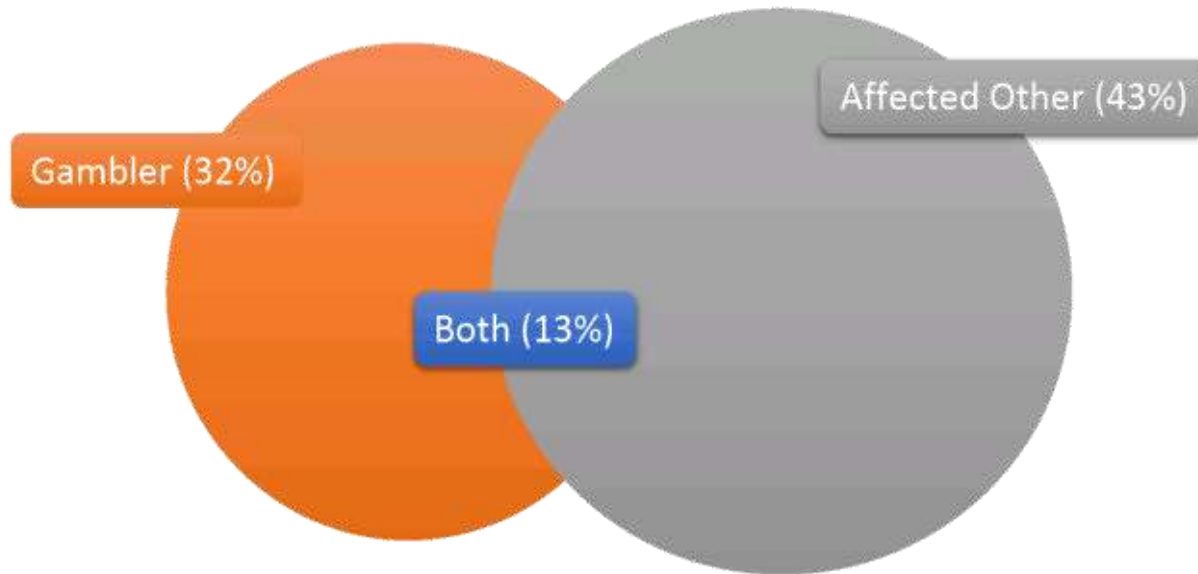
Councils have responsibilities under the [Gambling Act](#) and [Racing Act](#) to play a part in regulating gambling and must have policies about Class 4 gambling (pokie machines) and TAB venues.

Auckland Council will soon replace the policies of the seven previous councils with single policies.

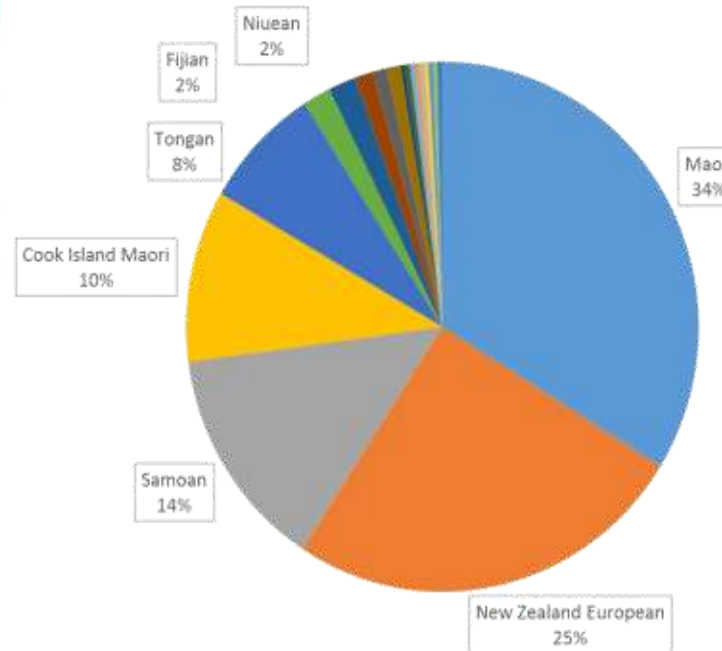
Community Probation Brief Intervention Scores – Henderson, 2016



Community Probation - Brief intervention scores according to ethnicity

Ethnic group	Positive screen rate
Maori	40% (25/63)
New Zealand European	29% (18/63)
All Pacific Islanders	23% (15/63)

Some facts about gambling in NZ 2015

- Money lost in 2015 \$2.091 billion
- Money lost on pokies 2015 \$818 million
- Lottery Commission lost 2015 \$420 million
- Money lost per day \$5.73 million
- Non Casino pokies lost per day \$2.3 million



Henderson – Massey stats

- Population: 107, 685 (Adult popl. 82, 810)
- Median income: \$26, 800 per annum (whole Auckland median: \$29, 600)
- Money lost to pokies in 2016: \$22, 237, 034.28 (That's \$60, 756.92 a day!)
- **23.1% growth in money lost compared to 2015!**
