A Mobility Dog provides companionship, an increased feeling of safety and helps to break down social barriers.

Requesting grant for	We are seeking funding towards the salary costs of our Senior Trainer. On average we have 70 dogs in the community, all at various stages. These numbers include our puppies in training, dogs working in the community as full service dogs, companion dogs or ambassadors. Our Senior Trainer spends a significant amount of time with the dogs coming into advanced training, preparing them for eventual placement with a recipient. This involves a variety of task-based training and familiarisation with mobility equipment, such as wheelchairs, and in different environments such as shopping malls, restaurants, buses and trains.
