Poverty Cyclists raise funds and awareness to further the work of Tearfund's international anti-trafficking partners; setting people free from modern slavery. PC helps make the community feel safe by increasing local awareness of the dangers of trafficking in the Western world. This project also supports mentoring of young New Zealanders transitioning from school to further work or education through two local partners. The annual PC event will run for the seventh time in 2017. It is one of Tearfund's iconic events and has become one of New Zealand's most popular cycling fundraisers for businesses, schools and community groups. Held at Ardmore Airport, everyone from Poverty Cyclists to side-line supporters from the Franklin community are invited to celebrate this fun, competitive relay. PC continues to grow both financially and physically. Last year 265 cyclists participated to raise \$125,000 for Tearfund's anti-trafficking and youth mentoring partners. This year we aim to have 350 cyclists raise \$200,000 to make a bigger difference.</p>
