Summary	<p>Coastguard Maraetai is one of the busier Sea Rescue units in the Northern Region. We are on call 24/7.</p> <p>In the past 12 months we attended 147 incidents (13 were urgent - the vessel is launched within 6 minutes) and brought 366 people home to safely to their families.</p> <p>The 35 crew contributed over 6300 volunteer hours - Rescues (over 1400 hours) Training (2000), Boat checks and maintenance (1000). Community benefit:	<p>The Boating and Beach Going Community are our immediate beneficiaries - 50% of boaties rescued were from South Auckland in the past year.</p> <p>During the Mayday fund raising campaign we run a family focussed open day to demonstrate the equipment and activities involved in Coastguard work.</p> <p>Our Summer Lottery Sales campaign engages with businesses and organisations in our community and The Annual Charity Golf Day is an opportunity to work with Pohutukawa Coast Rotary, Pohutukawa Coast Sea Rescue Trust and Clevedon Lions to encourage the wider community to support Coastguard Maraetai.</p> <p>Coastguard Maraetai supports community activities including the local Christmas Parade, Trolley Derby, Maori Tri, Rotary Mid-winter Swim, Ocean Swim events and Power Boat Racing</p> <p>Coastguard Maraetai undertakes an annual recruitment drive in April to encourage and inspire others in the community.</p> <p>Part of the Coastguard mission is to provide public education in water safety in an effort to positively influence the behaviour of the boating public.</p>

Criteria for the grant	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • equipment replacement expenses <p>Coastguard Waiuku are on call 24/7 operating search and rescue, and breakdown support to the Manukau Harbour, West Coast and Waikato River. We respond to requests for assistance from local boaties, commercial sea operations, police, harbour master and more. Many of our operations require night searches for vessels that have failed to return from their daytime excursion. If people are in the water, every minute counts to have a better chance of saving a victim. Night operations make navigation and visibility of victims difficult. An essential piece of our search and rescue equipment is night vision enhancement equipment. Modern equipment is far superior to that which we currently have on board our vessel. An upgrade is required.</p>

Actions taken to date:	We have investigated equipment purchase options and received quotes from Coastguard suppliers.

This will benefit to our local community by reducing the time taken to receive medical assistance. This in turn results in an increased chance of survival and recovery of the victim involved.</p>
Community benefit:	The benefits to our local community will be gained by have suitably trained lifeguards available to deliver first response medical assistance while they are out enjoying Franklins coastal area.
Actions taken to date:	Suitable and dedicated lifeguards have been identified to take part in the training. We have approached First Aid Training Provides to quote on delivering this training.
