Most organisations in NZ are for the hearing population. There is very little help for Deaf people especially those with mental health issues.

To remind and inforce to them that they are important members of the community and that they are valued. We can tell by talking with our current members how our meetings are making a difference to their lives, have gained to complete a meal has improved their wellbeing. Being part of an environment where NZSL is the sole language used allows the members to relax and communicate freely with each other.

Summary	Cash for Containers intends to run bottle drives at Waitakere Ranges Local Board area events to encourage and support waste free events. At each event we will set up a "bottle buy back" stall. People will purchase a bottle at a vendors stall, and can bring the empty container to our staff for a 10c 'refund'. We can "buy back" as many bottles as we have funding for. For example - \$200 allows us to "buy back" 2,000 bottles.
