<b>Summary</b>	Our coordinators recruit, screen and train men to be long-term volunteer mentors for fatherless boys. A robust screening process ensures they are emotionally healthy and safe to be in sole care situations with young boys. Each Big Buddy then spends several hours a week with his Little Buddy.		
<b>Requesting grant for</b>	Laptop computers and part salary for our volunteer coordinators.		
<b>Cost of participation</b>	No. Participation is free.		
<b>Active participants</b>	600	<b>Audience size</b>	600
<b>Promotion</b>	Yes - Pamphlets, website, Facebook, TV and newspaper advertising.		
<b>Local board recognition</b>	Acknowledged on our website and Facebook.		
<b>Reason for the project</b>	We maintain a database of Little Buddies waiting for a match. We currently have more Little Buddies waiting than Big Buddies in training. The Census shows 52,500 boys aged 7-14 living in single parent households. We estimate 8,000 will be truly fatherless – boys who have no on-going contact with an adult male.		
<b>Community benefit</b>	Boys with a mentor do better at school and are better adjusted and prepared for their role as an adult male. With a good role model, they learn what it means to be a good man. This creates well-adjusted men who are an asset to their community.		
<b>Alignment with local board priorities</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>People are supported to lead and develop projects and create opportunities for young people</li> </ul> We match adult male volunteers as long-term mentors for fatherless boys.
