Farmers Market proposal for Lloyd Elsmore Park - Nikki Clendinning	Local Initiatives and specific directions	The board provided feedback on the proposal for a commercial license for a Farmers Market in Lloyd Elsmore Park. ACTION: Lloyd Elsmore Park is not a suitable venue for a Farmers Market. Request staff explore other options with the applicant for an alternative venue. Officer to advise if a Resource Consent is required to hold a Farmer Market.
ACE - Youth Feasibility report - Asma Bashir, Mar Dawson and Natasha Karsan (Chair) and Zachary Wong (Project Manager) from the Howick Youth Council	Local Initiatives and specific directions	Members of the Howick Youth Council reported back to the board on the Youth Feasibility Study. ACTION: A formal report to the 19 June Business Meeting to adopt the study and request options for exploring stage one in 2017/18.
