Panuku gave overview of Northcote project. The business case for Northcote was signed off by Panuku Development Auckland in March which included approval of the project as a 'Transform' project which allows for the best urban regeneration outcomes: including a fully regenerated town centre with up to 1,000 units. It also means strategic purchases will be self-funding over time and public realm projects can be funded from a range of funding sources.
