The work is guided by a conservation plan and has had ongoing specialist input to ensure the work complies with best practice principles. The applicant has also provided evidence that resource consent has been obtained. The Rawinia Roa and William Sullivan graves are in poor condition and this project is essential to ensure their short-medium term survival - parts of the graves have deteriorated and fallen off and have been taken from the site. Te Muri has been identified as having mana whenua values in the Auckland Unitary Plan (Operative in Part). It is a culturally significant site to Ngāti Manuhiri and they are supportive of the project.</p> <p>The family has been in touch with Auckland Council for several years about the project to ensure the grave repair follows good practice principles and that the necessary permissions have been obtained. They have also sought specialist advice from a conservation specialist, who has prepared the quote. The house was built in 1863 by Benjamin Strange using stone from Rangitoto Island. The house is three storied with 12 sash windows, ornate barge boards and a plaster exterior finish. Its proximity to the Parnell Railway Station means that more people will be passing the building than in the past. Mount Victoria Cemetery is a council owned cemetery notable as it is the resting place of Patuone, the notable Ngā Puhi rangatira, his grave and headstone being provided by the New Zealand Government in 1872, and also his close friend Gladwin Wynyard and his Maori wife Wahinekino, of Ngāti Kahungunu.
