Governance Framework Review

I have been visiting Local Boards alongside the Deputy Mayor and Leigh Auton as part of the Governance Framework Review Political Working Party. This project is evolving to be an exciting piece of work that has the potential to provide Local Boards with the decision making and associated budgets to fulfil their roles as designed under the legislation. Recommendations will be put to the Governing Body on the 3rd of August for their consideration. This is a one-time opportunity to effect the change Local Boards have been requesting for 6 years and I hope all elected members will support it.

Te Mahia

Leigh Auton, Daniel Newman, Neil Punja and I met with Auckland Transport this week to discuss the gating project at Manurewa Train Station. At the meeting we were advised that Auckland Transport has prioritised 2.5 million dollars into the annual plan to support the Town Centre Steering Groups Te Mahia Station project. This is great news for the Board who committed 2 million dollars in the hope that our advocacy would result in this project being progressed. Timing is expected to be April 2018.

Relationship Agreement Ngati Tamaoho

Rangi, Daniel and I joined the Otara-Papatoetoe and Mangere-Otahuhu Boards in signing our relationship agreements with Ngati Tamaoho. Although we already hold a meaningful working relationship with them the signing of the agreement was a poignant occasion and one for the history books.

Response to the Housing Crisis

Congratulations to the Board on taking a governance leadership role in addressing the complex outcomes of the housing crisis specific to Manurewa. A second meeting with key stakeholders was held this week with immediate actions taking place each day to address the pipeline on issues that range from mental health drug and alcohol addiction to bureaucratic policy that has resulted in Auckland being 15,000 houses short of where it needs to be.

Local Economic Development Masterclass

I was invited to participate as part of a three person panel discussion at the ATEED Economic Development Masterclass at the ASB Viaduct Conference Centre last week. Specifically to discuss the Town Centre Steering Group model we have implemented using an independent Chair and informed by multiple stakeholders both within and outside of the Council family. This is another leading initiative the Board can be very proud of implementing.
