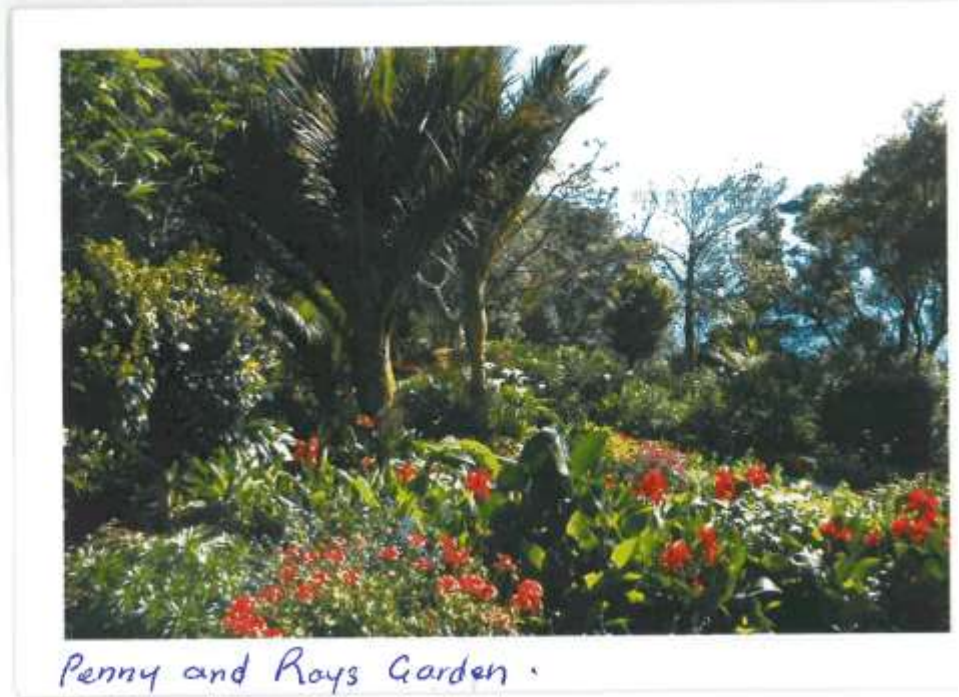

To the Waiheke Local Board.

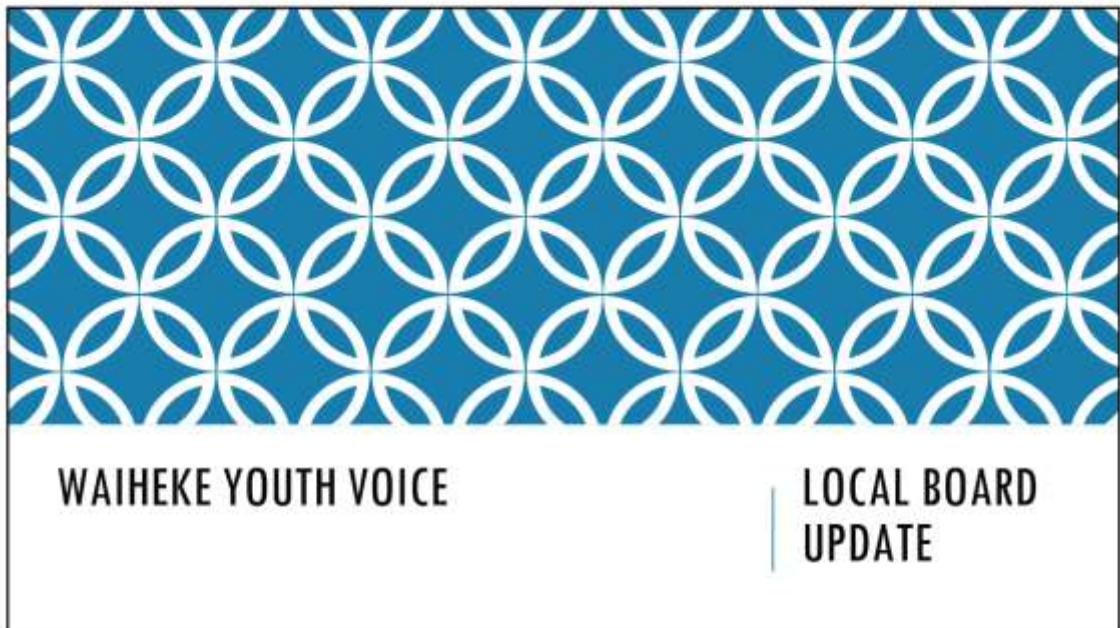
I would like to acknowledge the generous contribution made by the Board to Ray's funeral.

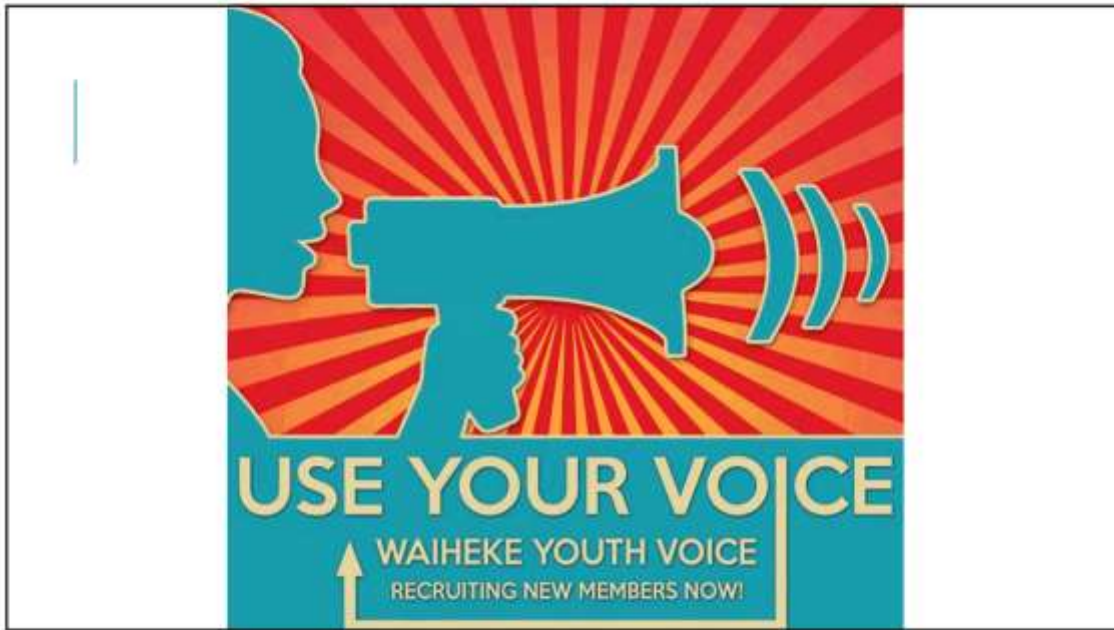
It was sincerely appreciated by the whole family. Our thanks to you all.

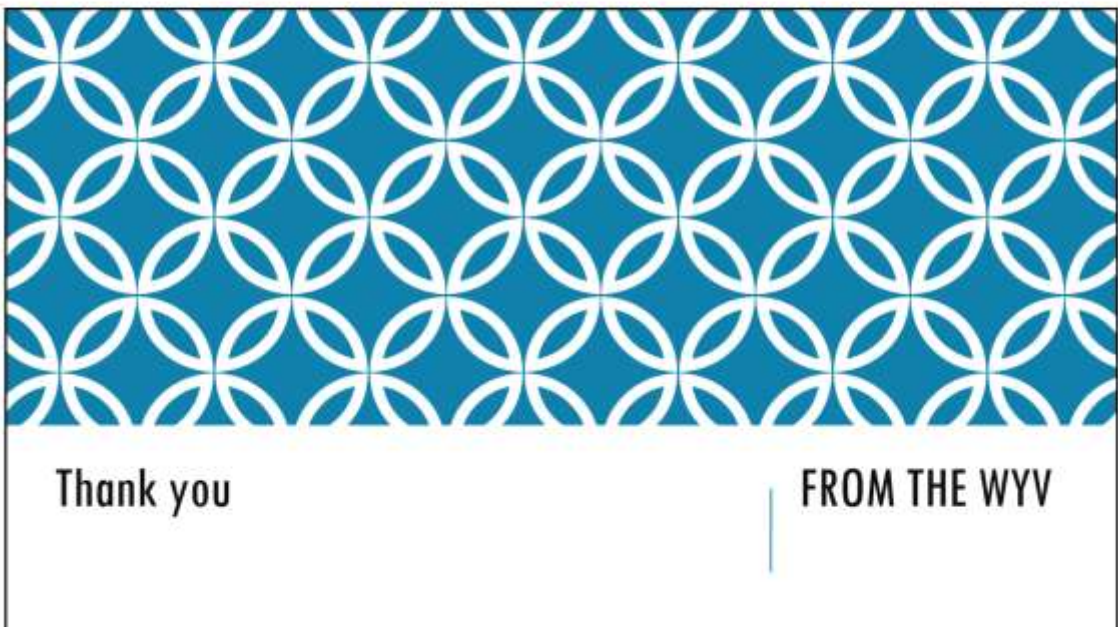

Dear Local Board Members,

Request for Storm Water Forum

At the April 2017 meeting, I asked the Board to support and help promote a Storm Water Forum on island.

Recent publicity highlights the ongoing impacts of further flooding and slips. Damage and costs have not been insubstantial, and in all likelihood, these will continue to contribute to ongoing stress and financial worry within the community for some time to come. A period of intense rainfall during the early hours of Sunday the 9th July caused further flooding and damage to properties. Aside from two cases before the Environment Court, community groups are aware of six other cases in the Trig Hill Road area alone. Inevitably, further incidents of storm related damage will come to light as time passes.

One cannot help but feel that the issue of flooding and storm water is a bigger issue than residents have so far been led to believe.

A comprehensive survey, as a function of the proposed Storm Water Forum, would identify and collate known hot spots, as well as encourage disclosure of further incidents which remain, as yet, under-reported. To realistically gauge the extent of problems likely to be faced, the community needs an accurate assessment of the nature and scale of what they are being asked to deal with. Without collective effort neither community, nor Council can reasonably expect to adequately prepare or plan for, the inevitability of future storm and storm water related events on Waiheke.

Clearly residents have yet to be fully appraised of their legal rights and obligations in light of the 2015 Storm Water By-Laws, and, of recent and ongoing legal decisions and case law which directly affects their relationships with their neighbors and with Council

I therefore renew my call for a Storm Water Forum, asking that the Board, take time to deliberate, so as to set out its response to this renewed request - in writing.
