

Local Board views

1. Albert - Eden Local Board (Resolution number AE/2017/56)

That the Albert-Eden Local Board:

- a) Notes the attached Governing Body report (Attachment A) provides information to assist to make a recommendation on Easter Sunday trading, including:
 - i. background on the Easter Sunday trading legislative change, rationale, current regulations
 - ii. options for responding to the legislative change, including:
 - iii. issues and options analysis
 - iv. pros and cons.
- b) Recommends that the Governing Body retain the status quo, so that only shops that can currently open for trade on Easter Sunday can continue to do so; providing that the public feedback from Albert-Eden residents support this.

2. Franklin Local Board (Resolution number FR/2017/81)

That the Franklin Local Board:

- a) notes that the Governing Body report (Attachment A to the report entitled 'Local Board recommendations on Easter Sunday trading') provides information to assist to make a recommendation on Easter Sunday trading, including:

- b) recommends that the Governing Body adopt a policy to allow shops in all of Auckland to trade on Easter Sunday.

- b) note that insufficient information regarding the public feedback on the Easter Sunday Trading consultation has been received to make an informed decision at this point.
- c) subject to receiving the public feedback, delegate the local board chair to recommend to the governing body by email via the Manager Social Policy and Bylaws by 30 June on whether to retain the status quo, or to allow shops in all or parts of Auckland to trade on Easter Sunday.

Background Comments:

1. The compressed timeframes proposed for local board feedback have not enabled a meaningful engagement with the local board or for the local board to engage meaningfully with our communities.
2. The public consultation feedback assessment, upon which a decision is to be made, was preliminary, received too late (the day of our business meeting), too high level and aggregated the central and eastern local boards.

9. Whau Local Board (Resolution number WH/2017/71)

That the Whau Local Board:

- a) recommend that the Governing Body retain the status quo, so that only shops that can currently open for trade on Easter Sunday can continue to do so.
