E tangi ana ki te tangata
Ko Moehau ki tai, ko Te Aroha ki uta
Ko Tiikapa te moana, ko Hauraki te whenua
Ko Marutuahu te tangata
*The hills of Hauraki stand enshrouded by stars,
I greet the land,
I cry for the people,
Moehau the mountain to the coast, Te Aroha mountain inland
Tiikapa is the sea, Hauraki is the land
Marutuahu is the ancestor*

The Ngaati Whanaunga emblem depicts Te Whare Tapuu - the house of Ngaati Whanaunga, with Ranginui above and Papatuanuku below. The preferred practice for Ngaati Whanaunga tribal elders is to use the double vowel rather than a macron.

Background information on Mangere

The development of market gardening brought more people into the Mangere area and the land remained used in this way until the 1960s when housing developments were created to service Auckland's growing population and industry in nearby Onehunga and Otahuhu.

Some areas of Favona also historically had large areas of greenhouses for tomato production. A market garden is the relatively small-scale production of fruits, vegetables and flowers frequently sold directly to consumers and restaurants. The diversity of crops grown on a small area of land typically from under one acre (0.4ha) to a few acres, or sometimes in greenhouses, distinguishes it from other types of farming.

Suggested Street Names (Theme: Market Gardens)

Tupuke Street

(verb) to earth up, mound up (ground for crops).

*Ka mahi anō a ia i tētahi ahuahua kia pērā me tō mua, ā oti noa tana māra te **tupuke** (TW 5/2/1876:70). / He then makes another mound like the previous one, and eventually completes the mounding up of his garden.*

Puaka Street

(noun) flower.

*Ka makā atu e Taininihi tōna kura, ka ākiritia ki te waitai i tana kitenga tuatahi i ngā **puaka** ngangana o te rātā (TMT 2/9/1861:11). / Taininihi threw away his treasured possession, he threw it into the sea when he first saw the red flowers of the rātā tree.*

Makuru Street

(noun) abundance, profusion, fruitfulness.

*Auina ake i te tau tuatahi nui atu te **makuru** o te kūmara (TP 4/1912:5). / Later in the first year the abundance of the kūmara was greater.*
