They are also aligned to the draft local board plans. Members would like to know how they align with other council strategic plans?</p> <p>Need to set the scene for future state and planning – how do we get there and what is the strategy for achieving this?</p> <p><u>Actions</u></p> <p>The IAP team will arrange a further 1 day (Friday) workshop with the Manurewa and Papakura Local Boards and Mana Whenua</p>

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			<p>to explore the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Overview of feedback is high level and sets the 10 themes / priorities. There is a need to drill down to the individual pieces of feedback received to establish in more detail what the community is saying – is there anything new that the boards are not aware of.</li> <li>2. Establish if there is any connectivity, synergies, opportunities and / or projects that would allow collaboration across all 3 areas of Manurewa, Takanini and Papakura – linkages between the three communities.</li> <li>3. Establish what projects other council departments, external contractors, steering groups, central government etc. are already working on or delivering that align with the LBPs and IAP – is there any leverage to connect project teams together – strength is in working together.</li> <li>4. Identify any gaps or barriers that may hinder the delivery of projects or outcomes being sought.</li> <li>5. What are the connections and alignments between delivery / key actions and aspirations?</li> <li>6. Need to look at area wide and area specific actions.</li> <li>7. Need to establish and agree a series of actions / implementation plan from the feedback received that allows for best leverage.</li> <li>8. What resourcing / support is available or could be available to implement these actions from the local boards, wider council organisation and external parties.</li> </ol> <p>More information is required on how messaging will go back to the community on projects that are</p>
