30 March & 5 July 2017	The first Diversity Forum was held on 30 March with over 30 people from the diverse community attended. The second one was held and on 5 July with over 50 attendees.
11 March 2017 6 July 2017	Otara Neighbourhood Day and Otara Court Neighbourhood Day were successfully held with funding from the Ōtara-Papatoetoe Local Board:
30 June 2017	Signed a mana whenua relationship agreement with Ngāti Tamaoho on 30 th June 2017.
18-30 June 2017	Funded Auckland Transport to trial a programme to inform and sign-up cash customers to the AT HOP card in the local board area.
20 June	Approved a relationship agreement template as the basis for discussions with mana whenua
June 2017	 Two Marae Whakawhanaunga Mai Tauiwi events (12 and 29 June) to welcome diverse new residents via powhiri and engage them in a basic Tikanga Maori programme that were attended by more than 100 people in total A Bylaws tour on 15 June that presented 55 locals some information about how the local board works and what some basic bylaws and legislations are that affects them A Community Funding workshop on 23 June with 50 participants learning about council's funding opportunities and how to make applications more successfully
20 June 2017	Approved 2017/2018 work programmes for ACE, community facilities, and local environment.

6 June 2017	Approved funding to Build capacity: community-led response to alcohol licensing and advertising.
6 June 2017	Adopted the Local Board Agreement 2017/2018.
6 June 2017	Approved the Libraries, and Parks, sport and recreation annual work programmes for 2017/2018
29 May 2017	The Ōtara-Papatoetoe Local Board 'Have Your Say Event' consultation for the Local Board Plan was held on 29 May 2017.

16 May 2017	The Board approved grants for the Papatoetoe Sports Awards Trust to support the Papatoetoe senior and junior sports awards.
16 May 2017	Approved grant for The Southern Initiative's crowd empowerment platform 'UPsouth'.
3 May 2017	LGG Youth Connections organised Jobfest on 3 May 2017 at the Vodafone Events Centre with 1,400 youth registered and 75 businesses signed up as pledge partners.
18 April 2017	Approved the Local Grant Round Two and Quick Response Round Three 2016/2017 (\$55,573)
18 April 2017	Approved the draft Ōtara-Papatoetoe Local Board Plan 2017 for public Consultation
18 April 2017	Approved the Greenways/local paths plan.
18 April 2017	Approved the terms of reference for a collaborative approach between Panuku Development Auckland, Ōtara-Papatoetoe Local Board, and Manurewa Local Board to the Transform Manukau project.
March/April 2017	The Board funded "Eye On Nature" event which is an environmental education event held annually at the Auckland Botanic Gardens. The 2017 event ran from 28 March to 1 April 2017 and included three schoolonly days from 28-30 March, concluding with a free family day on Saturday 1 April.
21 March 2017	The Board named the new road created by way of subdivision at 172 and 172A Portage Road, Papatoetoe, "Deepak Lane" which is the first Indian name given to a road in the Local Board area.
February 2017- November 2017	The Chair of Ōtara-Papatoetoe Local Board, Lotu Fuli is mentoring Atarau Pouwhare-Ellis as part of the 2017 TUIA Te Here Tangata rangatahi (youth) leadership mentoring programme. In addition she is also mentoring 3 students as part of Moana Pasifika Mentoring Programme.
13 December 2016	Approved grant application for Quick Response, Round Two, 2016/2017 (\$20,975)
13 December 2016	Approved funding \$20k for Industry Pollution Prevention Programme at Wiri.
13 December 2016	Acknowledged 8 local schools' principals who were retiring/retired/moving to another school by sending them thank you cards and flowers.
31 October 2016	Inaugural meeting of the new Ōtara-Papatoetoe Local Board. The newly Elected Members Apulu Reece Autagavaia; Ashraf Choudhary; Lotu Fuli; Mary Gush; Donna Lee; Ross Robertson; and Dawn Trenberth made declarations. Lotu Fuli was elected as Chair and Ross Robertson as Deputy Chair. Sistema Aotearoa children's orchestra provided entertainment.
