	<p>Testing Results</p> <p><i>Emma Joyce, Relationship Advisor</i></p> <p><i>Tim Hopley, Healthy Waters</i></p> <p><i>Kirsten Grant, Healthy Waters</i></p>	<p>decisions</p>	<p>update on the results of recent monitoring information at Weymouth beach and how the monitoring information can inform future actions to improve water quality at the beach.</p> <p>2014 - Investigation into the water quality at Weymouth beach began.</p> <p>Original water quality investigation report included boat ramp area and identified that the quality at different sites was not particularly poor.</p> <p>Worst results came from stormwater drain and middle of channel at the end of Roy's Road which then became main area of focus for testing.</p> <p>Pre-sampling showed that the pollution was from:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • human waste from private land • stormwater and wastewater • avian faecal matter • dog faecal matter. <p>2015/2016 - showed pollution had reduced significantly.</p> <p>2016/2017 - sampling showed the main source of contamination is stormwater.</p> <p>There has never been testing undertaken at the main beach area.</p> <p>In order to be able to remove the</p>

			<p>long term signage from the beach there must be improved water quality in the targeted areas.</p> <p>Need three years of continual clean data before beach can be re-opened. Currently have two years of data. If third year of data is clean then beach can be re-opened.</p> <p>Moving from water sample testing to “predictive modelling” - a web application.</p> <p>The board raised the following questions:</p> <p>Can the water testing site be moved? Answer - should a request for the main Weymouth beach to be tested – this will be classified as a new site. There is a set fund for the regional programme which is not able to be changed at the moment unless the board want to fund the monitoring for the new site. The current safe swim programme is limited in resources to collect / collate data.</p> <p>Is the main beach unsafe or not? What advice can we give the community?
