01	Manurewa Open Space Network Plan <i>Lucy Deverall, Policy Analyst</i>	Local initiatives/specific decisions	<p>Lucy talked through the feedback received from the board on the draft Manurewa Open Space Network Plan (MOSNP) and gave an update on the engagement process with mana whenua.</p> <p>The board provided the following feedback on the draft MOSNP:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> include Pahurehure Inlet check accuracy of the statement that suggests water quality does not adequately support recreational uses such as fishing, sailing, paddle boarding and kayaking, particularly relating to sailing and paddle boarding <p>Action Lucy to contact Healthy Waters for clarification.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> include an acknowledgment of the national award given for the Puhinui Stream as most improved clarify source of data for the following statement: "Both freshwater and marine

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			<p>environments in and around Manurewa were ranked as 'poor' in the State of Auckland environmental quality monitoring programme"</p> <p>Action Lucy will further investigate and provide a more site specific identification. The board requested that the generalised 'Weymouth Beach' pollution statement be changed to reflect recent improvements.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • identify opportunities with regard to Manurewa's relatively low tree canopy coverage to build relationships with industries to plant trees on their land, plant more street trees, and identify areas to increase undergrowth in the canopy areas. <p>Lucy advised the Biodiversity team are starting to prioritising this.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • clarify if Anderson Park would be considered an ecological link for native birds? If not where does it fall short? The board would like to get an understanding of what would be required <p>Lucy has spoken with the Biodiversity Team - generally parks that are a 'mown area' are not considered priority areas whereas coastlines are easier to link up with coastal priorities. Suggested a tree succession planting in that area through operations team.</p> <p>Lucy advised that her team are taking a different approach to iwi engagement and that all iwi engagement on open space network plans across the region will go through the Parks and</p>

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			<p>Recreation Iwi Engagement Forums. The board asked that as well as the above, iwi be invited to attend all Manurewa Local Board workshops on the MOSNP.</p> <p>The first opportunity will be in September when the board will be asked to develop key moves.</p> <p>Action The invite will be sent out from the Chair to local mana whenua. Trina to follow up.</p>
02	<p>Community Safety Placemaking Budget and CPTED review of the Northcrest Shopping precinct, Manurewa Library precinct and the Clendon Shopping Centre precinct</p> <p><i>Ayr Jones, Specialist Advisor</i></p> <p><i>Jane Friend, Strategic Broker</i></p> <p><i>Sunita Kashyap, Specialist Advisor</i></p>	Setting direction/priorities/budget	<p>CEU presented a number of options to the board on the distribution of the \$121k of the 2017/2018 Community-led Placemaking budget.</p> <p>The board queried the speed of the CCTV cameras. The quality of equipment is dictated by budget available. Equipment is upgraded when and where is possible.</p> <p>The board confirmed the proposed \$48k go to the Manurewa Business Association to deliver on increasing safety and resilience of local town centres and neighbourhoods.</p> <p>The board confirmed the proposed \$35k go towards maintenance of the council CCTV assets for 2017/2018 (CCTV Callouts and Maintenance).</p> <p>The board confirmed the proposed \$2k to go towards administering Neighbours Day activities.</p> <p>The remaining \$36k of the Community-led Placemaking budget will action recommendations from the CPTED review in Clendon as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • \$10k towards projects that support building pride in

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			Clendon <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • \$16k to a suitable group or association in Clendon to co-ordinate some of the recommended CPTED options • \$10k towards support and co-ordination of Clendon local business owners.
