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## Local Board input to Public alerting framework for Auckland (19 October 2017)

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- 1) That given Puketāpapa Local Board area encompasses the greatest diversity in Auckland, our Board area therefore could serve as a test case for how effective the strategies and progress towards resilience has been over the 5 years the Framework is designed to cover. If it works in Puketāpapa, it is likely to work in other pockets of diversity across the city.
- 2) The alert system needs to take into account the low level of English understood and the low level of connectivity in our area.
- 3) The alert system needs to be able to reach those most socially isolated and with few resources (such as lack of transport). There needs to be a development of a strategic action plan to build a strong community led team of linkers and catalysts who can reach out to those most socially isolated.
- 4) There alert system needs to utilise well recognised and meaningful symbols, photos and slogans for multiple uses to reinforce key messages suitable in various languages and covering people of all ages.
- 5) There needs to be social mapping of where those with mobility, dementia and other barriers to accessing emergency support services are living.
- 6) Our Board area is ideal for a meeting to assist in lifting awareness through diverse communities of the new Auckland Emergency Management direction, planning and strategies
- 7) Clarify the role of an Elected Member in the event of a Civil Defence Emergency.
