Parents attending playgroups feel connected and less isolated, receiving peer support as well as education and guidance from the group facilitator. Parents are taught how to use everyday items at home to help continue this development and how to make it fun and engaging. The wider community is also strengthened through these connections made by parents. New parents, particularly new migrants, with fewer external support structures, benefit greatly from these groups. Parents are also encouraged to volunteer, assisting with all aspects of facilitating the group and this is encouraged by the Playgroup Coordinator providing the volunteers with a sense of purpose and belonging.
