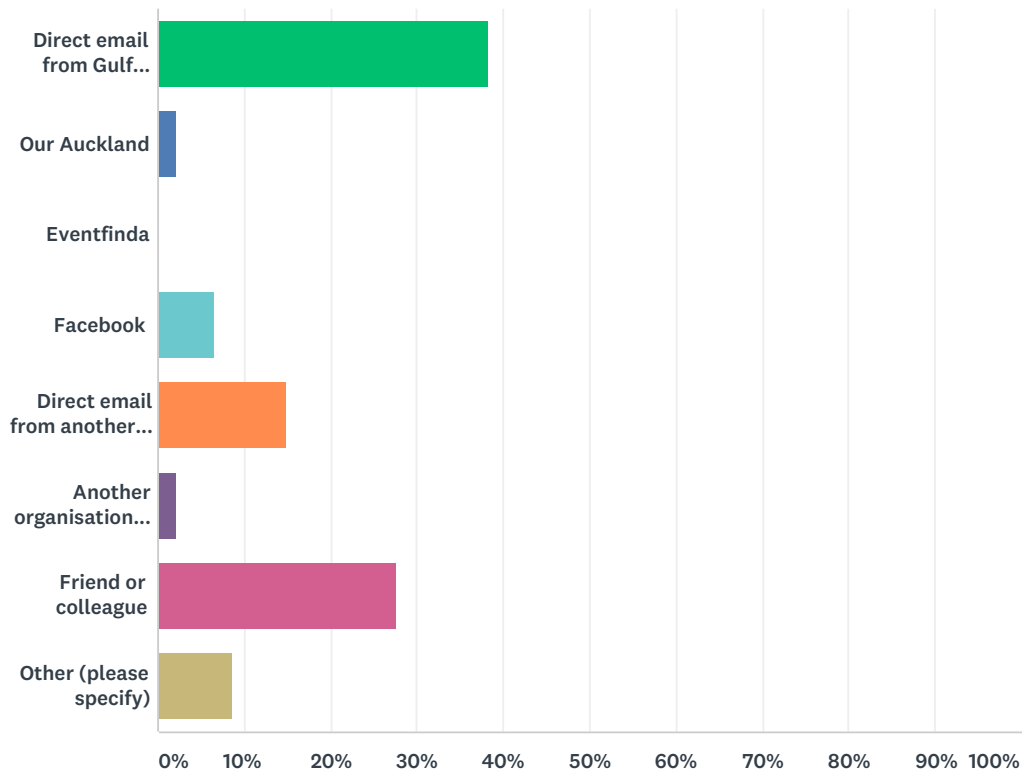

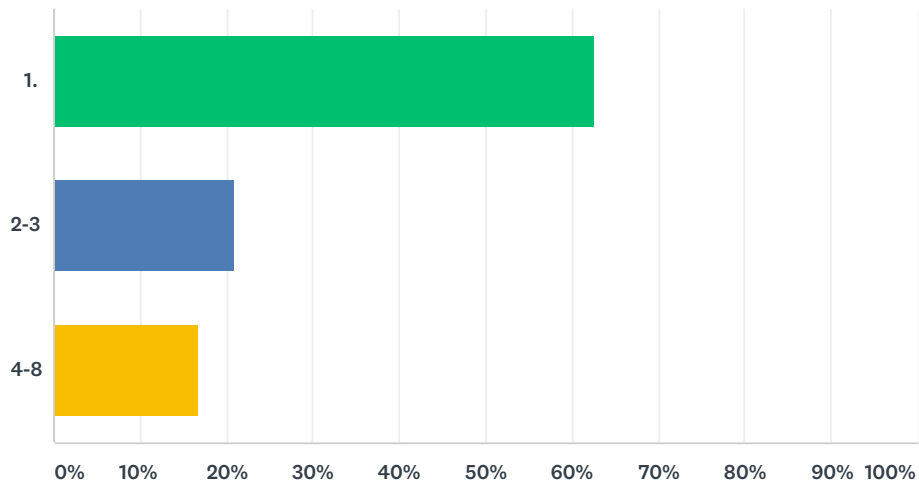

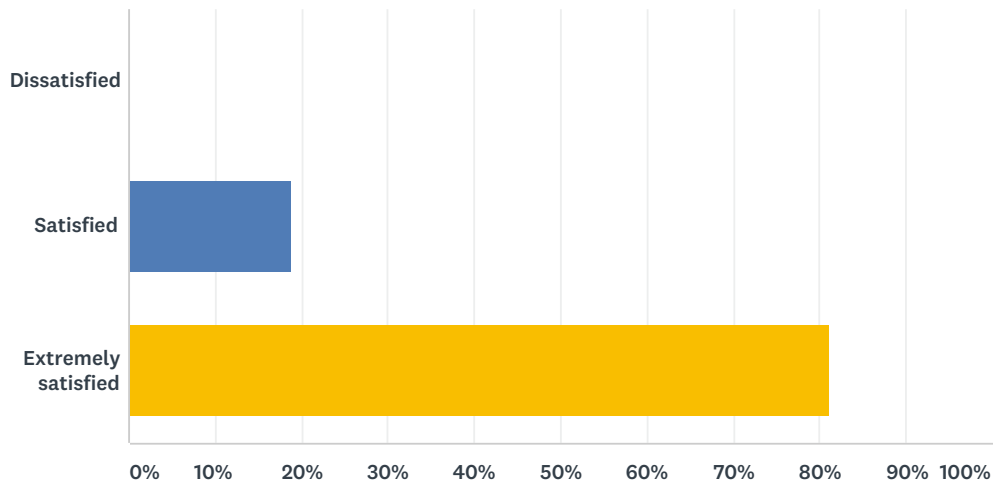

Q3 How satisfied were you with the content of the seminar programme overall?

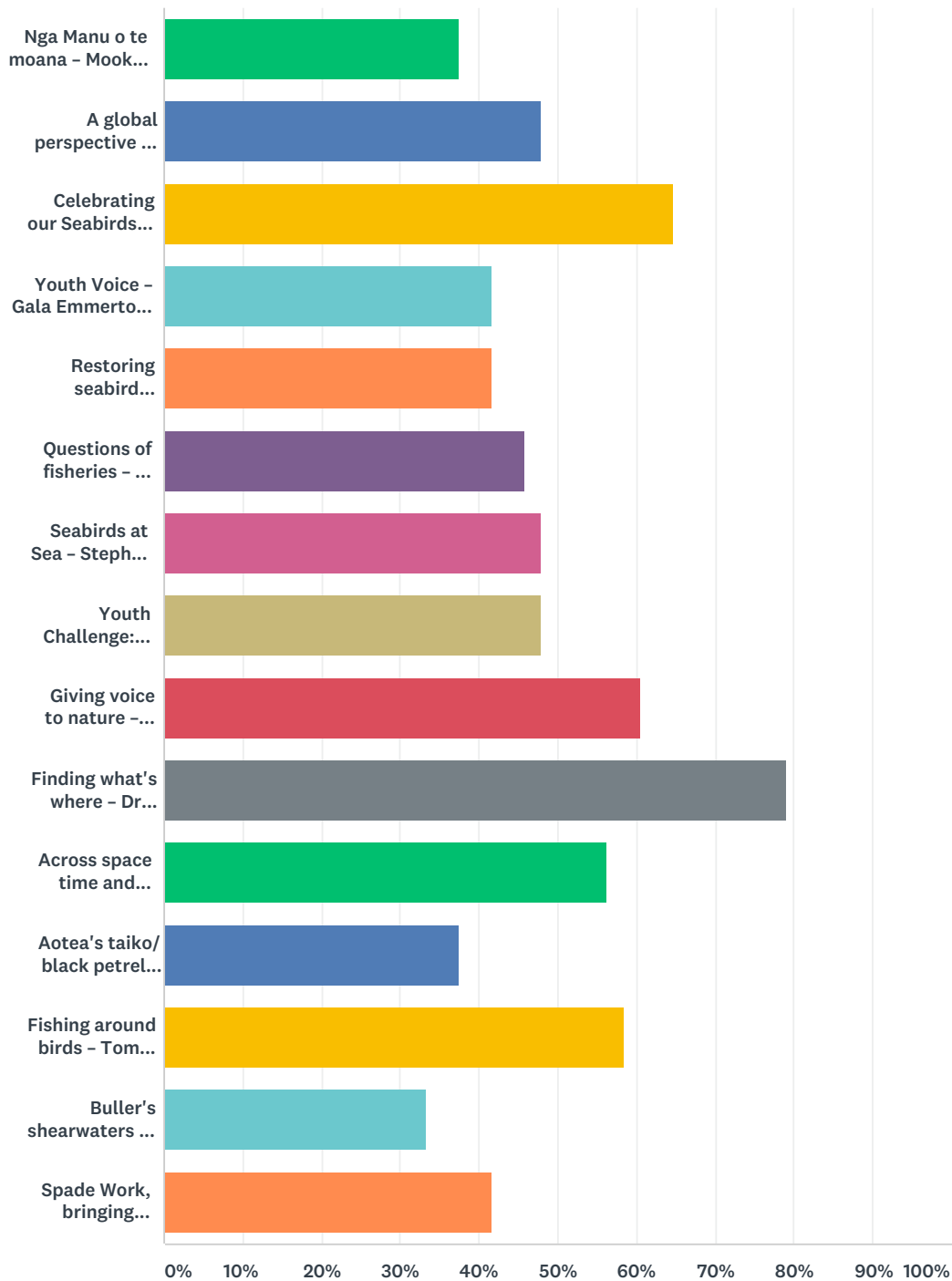

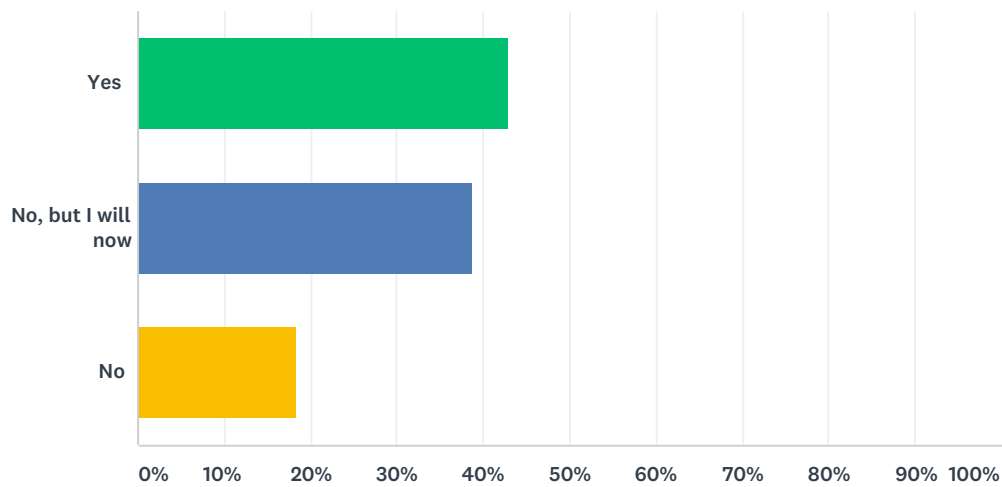
