- b) allocate \$1 million of the Henderson-Massey Local Board's Local Discretionary Initiatives capital funds to Panuku Development Auckland to lead, integrate and co-ordinate the delivery of the enhancement of Opanuku Reserve at 1A and 1B Henderson Valley Road;
- c) endorse Panuku Development Auckland as the lead agency for these projects under the Unlock Henderson programme;
- d) note that Panuku Development Auckland will work with the Henderson community as per the Unlock Henderson High Level Project Plan principles, Auckland Transport and Community Facilities to deliver the Opanuku Link project in accordance with the Urban Eco Centre vision and the Unlock Henderson High Level Project Plan.
