Summary:	Make Moments connects Auckland's older people and people with dementia with the rich arts and culture available at local art galleries, by engaging them in observation, discussion and reflection around artworks at Pah Homestead. We are the only organisation offering free facilitated art experiences that support this part of the Auckland community, and offer three complimentary postcards of the works for the participants to take home for reminiscence. We are seeking funding for the costs of the postcards which is a crucial component of the experience.

Community benefits

Identified community outcomes:

A recent research project that focused on the benefits of Make Moments, demonstrated the benefits of engaging in arts discussion and art making for older people, and people living with dementia. To be active and involved in their local community not only provides an opportunity for intellectual stimulation and social interaction, but it works to increase their feelings of self-worth, as well as to reduce the stigma and fears of those in the community.

This project will provide access to Pah Homestead and creative expression through facilitated discussion in response to the exhibitions.

The long term impact of this project will alter the way staff and visitors at arts venue engage with people with dementia.

Numbers of participants show numerical evidence of engagement.

Pre-, during- and post-project evaluations from participants, care staff and local venues of expectations and outcomes show qualitative outcomes.

Collection of photographs and video footage to show engagement, conversation and social interaction.

Interviews with participants, caregivers and staff from arts venues to measure impact and record anecdotal evidence.

Registered interest in future involvement from care staff for organised tours, as well as gauging continued support from the venue itself for us to continue to fill the programming gap for this audience.

Research of our project provides evidence that it successfully builds strong connections between participants, organisation and venues, and encourages an under represented portion of our society to feel that they are safe and valued part of our community. Project: Qualify Local Youth as Cycle Skills Instructors

Summary:	The Active Puketapapa Campaign includes weekly bicycle rides run by Global Light House youth leaders. A number of these leaders have been attending Cycle Skills Instructors courses to ensure the safety of those participating in the rides. We are seeking the grant to enable at least one of the leaders to become qualified as a Cycle Skills Instructor. They will be able to pass on the skills they learn. Participants in the weekly Cool Rides run by Global Light House are safe, can control their bicycles, ride to be seen and choose safe routes. They will also establish accepted Health and Safety systems such as Emergency Action Plans and Incident Reporting systems.

Community benefits

Identified community outcomes:

Participants engaged in community rides will be safe due to the presence of a qualified instructor, good Health and Safety procedures are being carried out during rides, and as a result of participating in rides increased health and well being will be experienced. Global Lighthouse runs weekly rides. Another example is the recent Puketapapa Heritage Festival Ride which had 30 participants. Many of those expressed an interested in doing further rides. A campaign is getting under way to promote groups rides in Puketapapa, for those who ask we will offer guides. It is the candidates for the training who will be the guides.

The attainment of the Qualification will be the main measure. Then observing bike ride records such as Emergency Action Plans and Incident Reports will let me know that the leader is prepared should an incident occur, and whether or not incidents are occurring.

The Active Puketapapa Campaign promotes active transport modes such as walking and cycling. This project is to enable local youth to be qualified as Cycle Skills Instructors so that the participants in the weekly Cool Rides run by Global Light House are safe. In participating in these rides they learn how to adopt healthy, sustainable and active lifestyles. If they need a bike they can access one through the Roskill Bike Kitchen enabling them to get around and be connected and safe in their community. The community will be strengthened due to the increased well being of participants.
