

Engagement Plan

Maungakiekie-Tāmaki Local Board - Long Term Plan 2018-2028 (10 year budget) and Auckland Plan Refresh Consultation

Background

Auckland Council is required to adopt a Long Term Plan (LTP), 10 year budget, every three years. The LTP sets out the priorities and funding for council activities that are planned over a 10-year period. It includes financial and non-financial information for the whole Auckland Council group.

The Auckland Plan was first adopted in 2012, with a commitment to review it in six years. The Auckland Plan is intended to contribute to Auckland's social, environmental and cultural well-being through a comprehensive and effective long-term (20 to 30 year) strategy for Auckland's growth and development. Both the LTP and Auckland Plan are influenced by the strategic priorities and directions set out in the Local Board Plans.

Engagement Purpose

Under the Local Government Act 2002, Auckland Council is required to formally consult the residents of Auckland on the LTP and Auckland Plan (spatial plan). The SCP submission process ensures that communities of Auckland have an opportunity to review the draft plans and make submissions both in person and in writing.

Local Boards play an integral role in the public consultation process. Local Boards have the discretion to decide how they wish to consult under the SCP, in a format that best suits their communities. The Local Board plays an important role in ensuring the people of Maungakiekie-Tāmaki are heard and considered as part of the Auckland-wide consultation.

Represent the views and needs of the community -

The purpose of the Special Consultative Process is for elected members to engage with their local communities on the topics decided upon by the Auckland Council. This engagement is to 'test' the draft plans with the community, with the main outcome to canvas the draft content and make final adjustments based on feedback.

Build and develop strong relationships in the community –

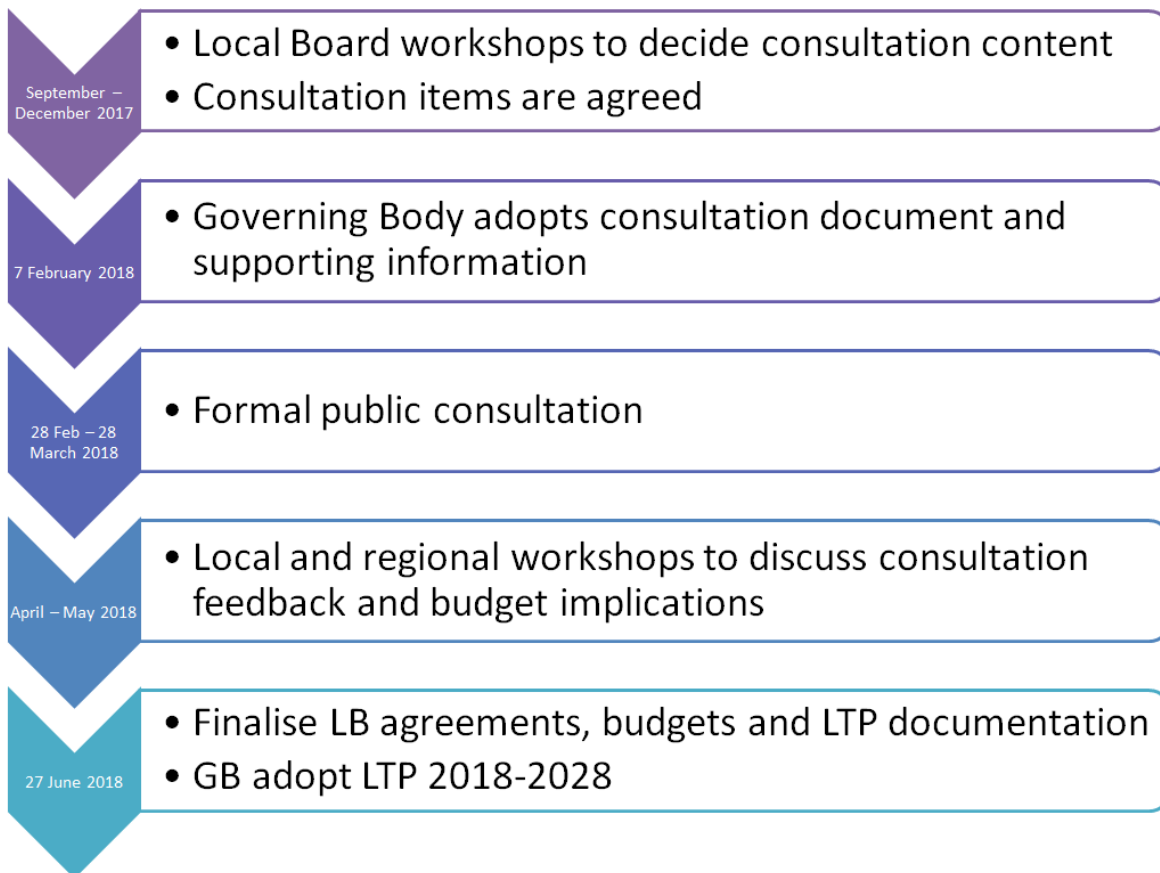
The Local Board will use a number of different promotional activities to reach its community. The intention is to develop ongoing and new relationships within the Maungakiekie-Tāmaki community. The process allows local board members to build on existing relationships within their networks and to generate new connections.

Transparent decision making from quality engagement –

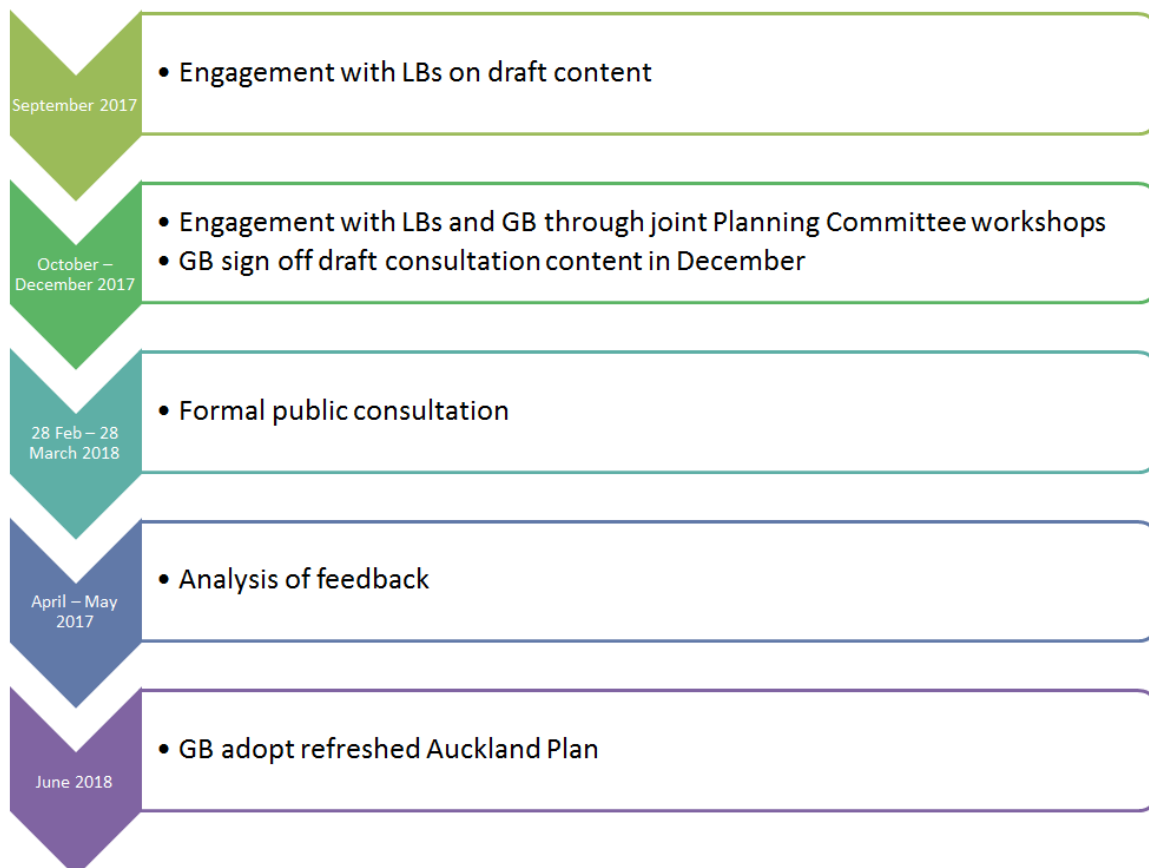
Submitters can provide their feedback through various channels throughout the consultation period. Each submitter will receive a feedback summary and decision rationale with links to the final plans. This approach means that submitters have a clear understanding of how their feedback was used and why decisions were made.
